TULELAKE, June 23—A general membership meeting of the Tulelake Growers association has been called for tomorrow night, Friday, at 8 o'clock in the veterans' training building on the high school grounds.

Purpose of the meeting is to work out details of handling labor during the harvest here next fall and to discuss wage rates.

It is not probable that a wage scale will be set at this meeting but such information as is needed to pass on to contractors, who will bring transient help in, will probably be available following the meeting.

Housing facilities for some 1200 single men will be available at the grower's labor camp at Newell but no provision will be made this year for families.

This does not indicate that family units will not be welcome for work in the fields, according to W. F. Currier, who stated that a survey is being made to determine how many farmers can provide living accommodations for families on individual farms.

Currier is asking the cooperation of growers in registering accommodations with the grower's office.

### Score Die In Flaming Plane Crash

BARI, Italy, June 23 (AP)—A four-engine KLM (Royal Dutch airlines) plane crashed in the sea off the coast of Bari, Italy, today, killing between 30 and 40 persons.

American, Dutch and Turks were said to have been aboard. Apparently there were no survivors.

A Bari port official said 24 bodies had been recovered, many badly burned. These included 16 men, five women and three children, he said.

Recovery of other bodies believed trapped in the wreckage was hindered by choppy seas. Italian navy divers and patrol craft were aiding in the recovery operations.

The plane crashed in bright, clear weather. A light northeast wind was blowing. Some accounts said the transport went down in flames from a height of about 15,000 feet.

### Spy Trials Bogged Down

WASHINGTON, June 23 (AP)—Judith Coplon complained in near hysterical tones today that the government is not giving her full freedom to defend herself against espionage charges.

"I feel that I'm kept in a straight-jacket," she shouted at John M. Kelley Jr., government prosecutor.

"I would like for the jury to see the kind of work I did."

Federal Judge Albert L. Reeves has ruled repeatedly that the government need not produce Miss Coplon's justice department "assignment sheet" showing the work she performed.

Miss Coplon said she wanted the jury to see all the reports that she ever wrote because "I want the people to understand."

She also protested that Kelley kept asking her questions that she could not answer "yes" or "no." That was in explanation of why she made long speeches after almost every question.
