

Fremont To Put Safety Measure In

Summer fire prevention regulations will go into effect July 1, on the Fremont national forest, according to Merle S. Lowden, forest supervisor.

These rules include no smoking while traveling, obtaining a camp fire permit, and carrying a shovel, axe and bucket while camping in the forest.

Camp fire permits are not required at the following campgrounds: Campbell lake, Cottonwood meadows, Deadhorse creek, Deadhorse lake, Dog lake, Drews creek, Finley corral, Hailey camp, Lee Thomas meadow, Marsters spring, Mud creek, North creek, Rock springs, Silver Creek marsh, Sprague river, Thomas creek and Willow creek.

Camp fire permits for other areas may be obtained at any guard or lookout station, at the rangers' offices in Bly, Paisley, Silver Lake or rooms 307 and 301 in the Lakeview post office building, and at the district rangers' office in the Klamath Falls post office.

"We appreciate the fine cooperation the public has given us in reporting fires," Lowden said. "It is important that all forest users com-

pletely extinguish their camp fires, and report all fires seen in the woods to one of the places listed above."

Tillamook To Get New High School

TILLAMOOK, June 23 (AP)—Tillamook is assured of a new high school, to be constructed in the southeast part of town.

Voters approved an \$800,000 bond issue Monday, 636 to 525, to finance construction. Work on the 16-acre site will begin this summer. Construction of the building will start next spring.

The newly organized Tillamook Y.M.C.A. has taken an option on the old high school for use after December, 1951.

YAKIMA, June 23 (AP)— Before adjourning their three-day conference yesterday, affiliated Northwest Indian tribes ANIT adopted a resolution protesting the government's opening of 818,000 acres of the Colville reservation lands.

Another statement, scoring government liquidation of reservation lands, declared: "The American Indian has already lost much of the great domain he once controlled, and he wants to keep what he's got left."

OVERTIME
Carpenters and cement finishers first four hours after eight, time and one-half thereafter double. Time and one-half for Saturdays and for over eight hours per day. Sundays and holidays double time.

Any minimum wages or overtime rates not shown will be those prevailing in the area as established by the Building Trades Office at Redding, California.

Any person making a bid or offer to perform the work shall in his bid set forth the name and the location of the mill, shop or office of each subcontractor who will perform work on labor or tender service in the contractor in or about the construction of the work of improvement and the portion of the work which will be done by each subcontractor in an amount in excess of one-half of one per cent (1/2%) of the general contractor's bid.
