

Bevos Climb To Sixth Spot In Coast Loop

West Blasts 27th As Padres Split With Hollywood

Split doubleheaders were the Sabath menu throughout the Pacific Coast league.
That is except for San Francisco, which had a twin-beating served up by Portland to give the Bevos an unquestionable hold on sixth place in the standings.
Max West came through with a choice tidbit for San Diego, his 27th homer of the season with two toward. This was the margin of a 6 to 3 win for the Padres over the loop-leading Hollywood Stars in the second game of the day.
In the opener Hollywood's Gordon Malberger kept San Diego well in check and the Stars turned in a well-done 12 to 5 victory. Herb Gorman and Irv Noren batted in five runs apiece for Hollywood as the Stars won the lopsided affair.
Buster T. Cannonball McDaniel, Los Angeles negro newcomer, tied up his third twirling victory in as many times on the mound as the Angels edged Seattle 7 to 5 in the first tilt. The Rainiers captured the nightcap 6 to 3 but Los Angeles, in the league cellar, won the series four games to three. Despite his triumph, McDaniel lacked speed and control, yielding 11 hits and five walks before he was yanked in the eighth. But he showed shrewdness in the clutches and received good support.
Oakland won a seven-inning opener 9 to 1 and Sacramento took the regulation nightcap 2 to 0. The second game win was Frankie Dasso's 12th victory of the year against four losses. Oakland ran away with the first game, clinching it with a six-run spurge in the first inning off Manny Salvo. The big punch was furnished by Frank Kerr with a homer, his first of the season.
Portland took the San Francisco heels 8 to 5 and 4 to 0. Portland's Hal Saltzman hurled neat two-hit ball in the nightcap for his ninth win of the season. Red Lynn, pitcher in relief for George Diehl, was credited with the Portland win in the opener.

Cripple Is Top In Traps

SACRAMENTO, June 27 (AP)—Though he has been crippled since boyhood, Fred L. Mosier of Fresno, Calif., chipped 98 out of 100 targets yesterday to win the Grand Pacific trapshoot handicap.
Behind second-place Harry Craker of Willows, Calif., who shot 97, came two Oregonians, Emerson Brickley, Eugene and Richard Baker, tied at 96. Billy Fox of Mount Vernon, Wash., had 95.
Earl Colson of Toppenish had 92, which along with his 198 in the singles and 94 in the doubles tied him with Bert Edmister, last year's singles champion for the all-around title. Colson forfeited the trophy, however, by leaving early.
The Redford (Wash.) gun club was awarded the 1950 Grand Pacific trapshoot tournament.
H. D. McElowney of Enumelaw was named president of the Pacific International Trapshooting Association.

Golfers Tee Off

AMES, Ia., June 27 (AP)—The "fastest field in history" teed off today in the opening spurt for medalist honors in the national collegiate golf tournament.
The "fastest field" label came from Ted Payerse of Northwestern university, NCAA golf chairman.
"We have champs by the dozen," remarked Payerse as he mentioned the entry list of 240 linksmen representing 60 colleges and universities. The school total is a new high for the 52-year-old tournament.
"We really have some grand kids and I look for a great tournament," Ted said.
Those "grand kids" were off today on an 18-hole test of Iowa State college's rugged 6555-yard layout through the woods near the campus.
It was the first half of medal play to determine the 84 qualifiers for match competition opening Wednesday. Also involved was a battle for team honors won last year by San Jose college.

Bobby Riggs Bops Budge

FOREST HILLS, N. Y., June 27 (AP)—Bobby Riggs is national professional tennis champion again because he is champion of a big, red-haired guy named Donald Budge.
The bandy-legged little retriever from Altadena, Calif., won the pro title yesterday, his third in the last four years, by turning back Budge, from Oakland, Calif., 2-7, 3-6, 6-3, 7-5.
Riggs defeated Budge for the championship in 1946 and 1947 after losing to him in the finals in 1942, when Don was at his peak.
There was just one hint on Riggs' conquest. It was achieved with the fellow who is regarded as the king pin of professional tennis—Jack Kramer—not around.
Kramer, last year's winner and victor over Riggs in their cross-country series, elected to stay around London and watch the Wimbledon championships.
