British Isle 'Pounded' By Attackers

LONDON, June 28 (AP)—The first phase of air exercises to test the defense of industrial England against an atom bomb blitz ended Monday with one major complaint, London residents said they were "too realistic."

Referees and high air officials of three countries were cagey about preliminary results of "operation foil" in which British bombers and fighters, American Superforts and jet fighters, and Dutch jet fighters participated.

There were indications from other observers and from the sound of heavy bomber formations over the metropolitan area that England's capital had been "heavily pounded" in two night attacks.

"Operation foil" will continue for another week as fighter and bomber squadrons, reinforced at weekend by reserve air formations of British pilots, test plans for protecting England in war. An air ministry spokesman said conclusions from the exercises will probably not be made public.

Thousands of aroused Britons, their sleep broken on a hot June week-end by low-flying warplanes telephoned the air ministry to complain. Many said their children, re-

minded of wartime blitz raids, ran screaming from their homes.

To these complaints an air ministry spokesman answered: "If we are to prepare an adequate defense our practices must be as real as we can make them."

Kaiser-Frazer May Open Up 1000 Plants

TOPEKA, Kan., June 28 (AP)—Kaiser-Frazer will build 1000 small final assembly plants throughout the United States if experimental units now under construction prove satisfactory, Edgar F. Kaiser said here today.

Kaiser, president of the Willow Run, Mich., Automobile corporation, said 20-car-per-day assembly plants will be completed in about three months at Portland, Ore., and Los Angeles.

He said the plants will be an experiment in labor relations. "It is my theory," Kaiser explained, "that we can obtain better

labor relations with decentralization since it will enable management to establish closer personal contacts with workers than is possible in a large plant."

He said he thinks better labor relations will result in increased worker interest in his job. This, Kaiser said, would result in increased efficiency and a higher standard of job performance which would be reflected in a better finished product.

Kaiser, here for a dealers' conference, said the company definitely will build 1000 of the 20-car-per-day plants if the Los Angeles and Portland branches produce expected results.

FLOOD
