

Gems Take Seventh Straight Victory

MEDFORD, June 29 (Special)—The fast-moving Gems extended their winning streak to seven straight games and climbed another notch in Far West baseball league standings to second place. Klamath Falls is just two games away from the league-leading Pittsburg Diamonds.

Last night the Spuds defeated the Medford Nuggets 5-3, the sixth straight win in the Oregon series. Elsewhere around the league Vallejo defeated Pittsburg 2-0 — the first time this year the Diamonds have been blanked. Willows topped Redding 5-1 and Santa Rosa scored twice in the top of the ninth to edge Marysville 2-1.

Klamath Falls now has a percentage of 800 (33-22) while Willows and Redding are tied at 593 (35-24). Pittsburg's percentage is .623 (38-33).

Williams Popular

CHICAGO, June 29 (AP)—For the second successive year, the Boston Red Sox slugging outfielder, Ted Williams, has become "popular champion" of the all-star baseball poll.

The nation-wide balloting by fans to select the starting American and National league lineups for the 16th contest, scheduled for Brooklyn's Ebbetts field July 12, ends at midnight tonight.

Final results will be announced Saturday by the Chicago Tribune, clearing house for the voting which began June 10.

Williams has collected 1,418,327 votes out of the total 3,408,772 cast in the latest tabulations. He was most popular choice last year with 1,556,784 out of a record-breaking 4,107,893.

Williams leads his nearest rival, Jackie Robinson of the Brooklyn Dodgers, by 85,924.

Ted Norbert Out; Earl Bolyard In

VICTORIA, June 29 (CP)—Ted Norbert, manager of Victoria Athletics, in the Western International baseball league, has been relieved of that position.

Reg Patterson, business manager, announced early today from Tacoma that Norbert will be succeeded by Earl Bolyard, long-time outfielder in the New York Yankees farm system, who has been managing the Norfolk, Va. club in the Piedmont league.

Patterson was advised yesterday by the Yankee management that Bolyard was being sent to the coast to take charge.

Norbert was appointed manager of the Athletics in the mid-season of 1946 when Victoria finished last. They were fifth in 1947 and in third place last year.

So far this year they have won 25 games and lost 43.

First Baseman Vic Buccola will handle the Athletics until Bolyard arrives.
