MW Catalogue Shows Price Cut

CHICAGO, July 1 (AP)—The fall and winter catalogue issued by Montgomery Ward and company,

officials said, contains the most extensive price reductions since 1938.

Officials of the mail order house said reductions, as compared with last fall's catalogue, included women's and misses' coats and dresses down 4 to 39 per cent; furniture 10 to 18 per cent; radios 10 to 20 per cent; auto batteries 15 to 25 per cent; and men's work clothing 3 1/2 to 20 per cent.

Also marked down were several building material items. These included oak flooring, down 20 per cent; kitchen cabinets, 21 per cent;

shingles, 12 per cent, and paint, 10 per cent.
