

Seven Cats Lose Out On \$2000 Will

SAN DIEGO, Calif., July 5 (AP)—Seven cats were out \$2,000 today but were promised care "within reason."

A probate court held there was no way to know if they were the cats willed the money by William Rushton Bowker, retired civil engineer and teacher.

Bowker died last May 31 at the age of 77. The will was written nearly three years before.

The court decided that after that lapse of time it was doubtful if the seven were the "beautiful pet pussy cats" referred to in the will.

A daughter, Miss Elizabeth Dorothy Bowker, said her father—who loved all cats and thought they brought him luck—at one time had as many as 22.

Miss Bowker, who has one cat of her own, said the seven would remain at her late father's home—at least until she and another sister take a planned trip to England.

She was authorized by the court to dispose of them in any way she deems proper.

Suburbs May Get Aid In School Row

PORTLAND, July 5 (AP)—The people who want Portland's new high school built in the suburbs instead of downtown may get an assist from the Multnomah county tax supervising and conservation commission.

The commission indicated it was considering asking the school board to hold up the whole project, pending further study. The board plans to sell Lincoln high to the state system of higher education, and build a new structure downtown.

The tax commission emphasized it didn't care about the school's site.

"But three million dollars is going to be spent on a high school," the commission said. "We just want to be darned sure when it is spent the school will be adequately built and located."

Ronald Phair Takes Lease On Mallory's "Y" Market

Ronald Phair, Klamath county rancher has taken a five-year lease on Mallory's Y market at the Merrill-Lakeview junction and has bought all the stock.

Phair has been a resident of this county for more than six years, farming in the Bonanza and Malin areas, owning, leasing and renting spud land in those locations. He had considerable grocery experience in Portland and Seattle before he came here. Phair now resides at 2036 Madison with his wife and five children.

Plans to rearrange shelves and stock, build up the hardware department, enlarge the dairy products department, build partitions and make other improvements are already under way at the market.

There will be no changes made in the present personnel, Phair said. The lease was effective as of June 21, but paper work on the transaction was not completed until the end of June. It includes only the market and outdoor vegetable stand. The furniture store, tavern, garage and oil station will be operated separately as always.

Harold Mallory, owner of the property, started his business with a grocery store at the site in 1941. He added the garage, frozen food lockers, tavern and service station. He pulled out the lockers and put the furniture department in that
