

### Wocus Youth In Hospital At Dallas

William Alcorn, who was injured recently in a car-train collision, is recovering quietly in a Dallas, Ore., hospital.

Alcorn, son of Mr. and Mrs. Aaron Hoffman of Wocus, received facial lacerations, a bad gash in his right hand, a broken leg, and reopened flank wounds.

According to reports, Alcorn was riding in a car driven by O. E. Frantz of Corvallis. Frantz failed to see a locomotive blocking the road as he approached on an "S" curve, smashing into it. Frantz was not hurt. Another passenger in the car, Robert Graham, received a bad cut over his right eye and possible internal injuries.

Alcorn will be in bed for two or three months.

### Murder Case Appeal Slated

ROANOKE, Va., July 5 (AP)—Attorneys for Lee Scott, 16, are expected to take steps Wednesday toward obtaining a modification of the 99-year-old prison sentence that faces him for the strangulation slaying of 16-year-old Dana Marie Weaver.

It is then that Chief Defense Counsel T. Warren Messick will tell Judge Kirk A. Kuyk why he thinks the first degree murder verdict should be set aside.

If the judge of Roanoke's Hustings (circuit) court does not set aside the verdict, Scott, Eagle Scout and choir singer, probably will be formally sentenced by the judge Wednesday.

If he is, his counsel has said the Virginia supreme court of appeals.

A jury Saturday found Scott guilty of slaying Dana Marie, his blonde classmate in the kitchen of Christ Episcopal church here and fixed his punishment at 99 years in prison.

So far Scott has appeared unaffected by the verdict.

His only comment on the punishment has been: "How many books do you think I could read in that time?"

### Famed Skipper Passes At 71

YONKERS, N. Y., July 5 (AP)—Capt. George Fried, 71, master of some of America's biggest ocean liners, died yesterday.

Captain of old Leviathan, America, George Washington, and President Roosevelt, Fried was a central figure in many thrilling sea rescues. While he captained the old America, the ship rescued 32 men from the Italian freighter Florida in a gale off Virginia.

In command of the President Roosevelt in 1928, he went to the aid of the stricken British freighter Antinoe in a North Atlantic gale, and lost two of his crew rescuing the freighter's company.

In 1932, two years before he retired, Fried took the Roosevelt to the rescue of Lou Reichers, forced down in the sea by a cracked wing when he tried to fly the Atlantic.

Fried became supervising inspector of the U. S. bureau of navigation and steamboat inspection after his retirement.

### REDS INCREASE AIR SERVICES

MOSCOW, July 5 (AP)—Soviet airlines have increased their flight schedules. From now on one flight daily instead of one flight every other day will depart from Moscow for Vladivostok.

Schedules of flights to Hakutsk from Moscow have also been increased. Freight-passenger flights from Moscow to Molotov (formerly Perm) in the northern Urals and to Omsk in Central Siberia have been added to schedules. There will be regular flights to the capital of Armenia, Erevan, and the Georgian city of Kutaisi from Moscow.

In addition to serve the flood of tourists going to Black sea and the Caucasus resorts this summer special flights have been put on from such cities as Sverdlovsk, Minsk, Kiev, Leningrad, Chelyabinsk, Novosibirsk, Irkutsk, Karaganda and Khabarovsk.

Other lines in addition are scheduled to be opened up in the near future. Many of the new lines will be served by the new model Soviet twin-engine transport plane, the 11-12 which is large and comfortable.

### Teachers Oppose Loyalty Oath

BOSTON, July 5 (AP)—Representatives of approximately 350,000 of the nation's school teachers adopted a resolution last night opposing loyalty oaths for teachers.

The unanimous action of 800 delegates—members of the Department of Classroom Teachers—was taken at a meeting held in conjunction with the 87th annual convention of the National Education Association. The resolution said the department "deplores the growing practice of enacting discriminatory legislation that singles out teachers."

Speaking for the resolution, Miss Hilda Masching of Washington, D. C., executive secretary of the classroom group, said: "If we are going to have loyalty oaths, then everybody should have them."

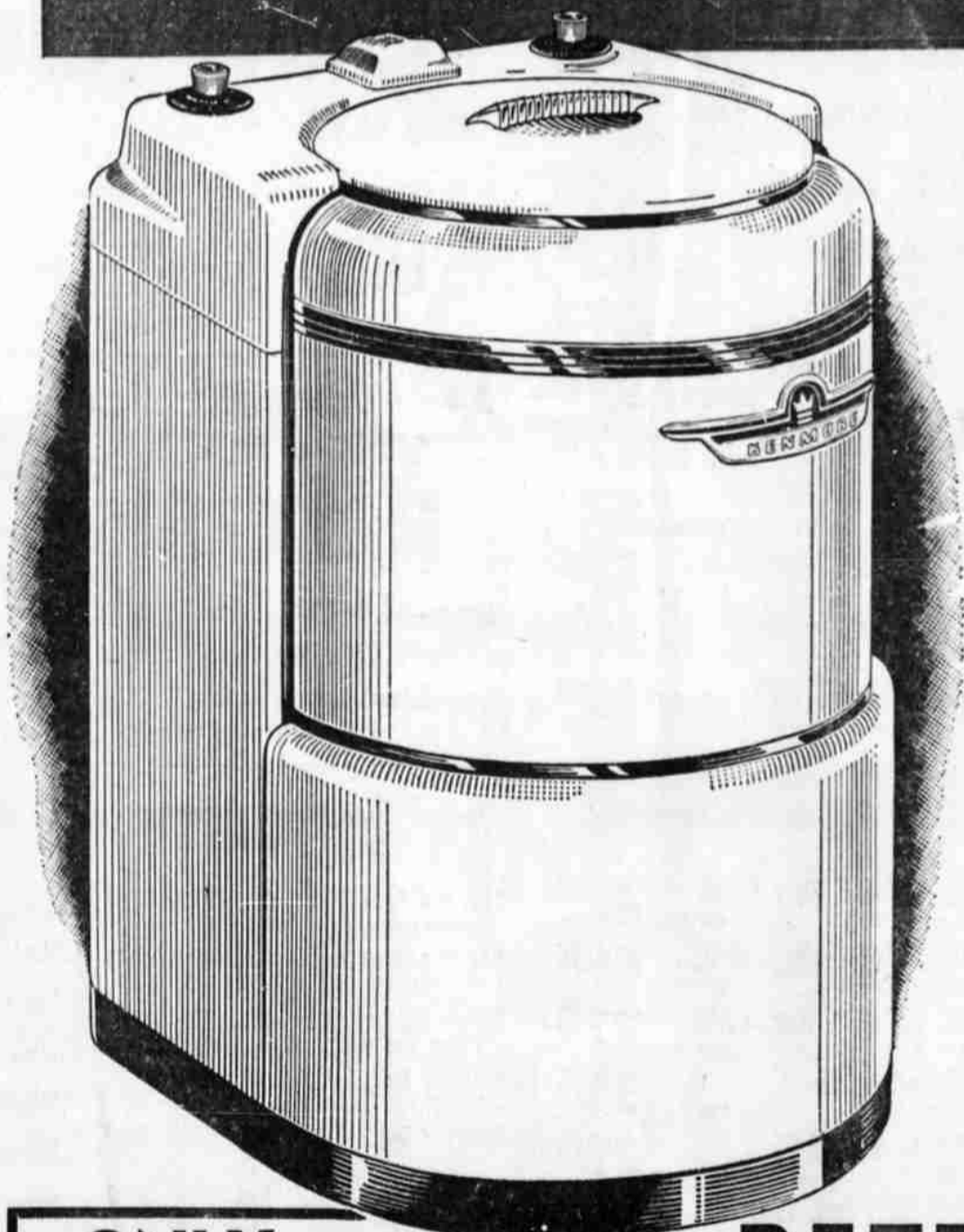
There has been some speculation that Shimoyama may have been kidnaped by labor elements as a protest against the economy move.
