

# Air-Terminal To Be Open On Saturday

SEATTLE, July 8 (AP)—A huge glass and concrete Seattle-Tacoma air terminal will open its \$4,000,000 facilities this weekend as the Northwest's gateway to the south, to the east, to the Pacific and over the great circle to the Orient.

Dedication ceremonies Saturday will round out six-and-a-half years of construction of the \$11,000,000 air field 12 miles south of here on the Seattle-Tacoma highway.

The so-called "international" airport, which will serve four different airlines, is considered by engineers to be one of the most modern of its kind in the world.

The six-story convex structure provides 175,000 square feet of floor space to meet all possible needs of air travelers.

Facilities include administrative offices, customs offices, baggage and waiting rooms, dining rooms, cocktail lounge, garage, post office, nursery, dressing rooms, barber shop, weather station, and an open observation deck 42.7m runs across the entire field-side face of the building.

The terminal is owned and operated by the Port of Seattle, the Bow lake site was purchased with \$660,000 from the Seattle port plus a \$100,000 grant from the port of Tacoma.

The field will serve Pan America

world airways, Northwest airlines, United airlines and Western air lines.

The 920 acres of land is located on high ground, some 400 feet above Puget sound, and the low lying Kent valley to the east, out of the smoke and haze of the industrial section of Seattle.

The longest of the four runways is now 6100 feet, which may be extended to 7500 feet.

Army, navy, marine and northwest national air guard planes will drone a dedicational salute in an air show Saturday beginning at 1:30. Commercial craft will be open for inspection on the field.

The inaugural address will be given by Gov. Arthur B. Langlie, with state and civil officials participating in the ceremony.

## Roosevelt Home May Be Shrine

OSTER BAY, N. Y., July 8 (AP)—Plans were nearing completion today to make Sagamore, Ill. the home of the late President Theodore Roosevelt, a shrine.

The Roosevelt Memorial association of New York disclosed it had made arrangements to acquire the three-story frame structure and 20 of its 83 acres of rolling land from the heirs of the late president.

Mrs. Roosevelt, 87-year-old widow of the former president, died last September. Since then, Sagamore Hill has been unoccupied except for caretakers.

The house was used as a summer White House by President Roosevelt.
