Organ Recital To Be Heard At Lutheran

Rev. C. C. Brown has been named general missionary and field worker of the Southern Baptist convention. Rev. Brown's appointment was announced following his unanimous election by the Oregon board of the Southern Baptist convention. He was formerly pastor of the First Baptist church here and since his resignation has been doing field evangelistic work around Oregon.

He will conclude his present work in Vancouver, Wash., within two weeks and will be transferred to Eastern Oregon for his next assignment.

He has also served on the board of directors of the University of Nanking and was on the executive committee of the East China Christian Educational association. They were repatriated on the first trip of the "Gripsholm."

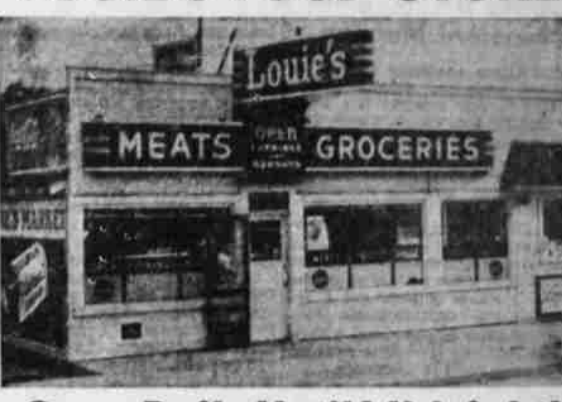
