PENSION PROBLEM

VIENNA (AP)—The Austrian government is paying more than \$65,000,000 annually in pensions to war invalids and near relatives of soldiers who never returned.

More than 505,000 persons—roughly eight per cent of the entire Austrian population—receive pensions.

Official figures show there are 166,643 war invalids, 84,033 war widows, 45,856 parents of killed or missing soldiers, and 85,019 war orphans.

There are a further 173,580 other relatives of missing soldiers on the pension rolls.
