

Local Boy Makes Good Lawrence Takes Over Sud Helm For Season

SEATTLE, July 19 (AP)—It was the old story of "local boy makes good" today for Bill Lawrence.

Of Highockets, who broke into professional baseball with Seattle in 1929, was named last night by President Emil Sick to finish out the 1949 Pacific Coast league season as headman of the Seattle Rainiers.

The lanky former outfielder returned from baseball in 1943 but returned as coach of the Rainiers this spring. He succeeded Joyner (Jo Jo) White as acting manager of the Seattle PCL club last week when White quit.

Lawrence played 12 of his nearly two score years of professional baseball with the Seattle club. He broke in with Seattle as a rookie in 1929 and was sold to Detroit at the end of the 1931 season. Three years later

Jackie Won't Be Caught

NEW YORK, July 19 (AP)—National league batsmen have just about given up hope of catching Brooklyn's Jackie Robinson in the batting race.

They've been chasing Robinson for seven weeks now, but after last Sunday's games, found themselves further behind than ever. Through the games of July 17, the fleet-footed second baseman had lashed out 117 hits in 322 times at bat for a .363 batting rate.

That figure was 31 points better than Ralph Kiner's runner-up mark of .332. The powerful Pittsburgh slugger wrested second place from New York's Willard Marshall, who slumped off 11 points to a fourth place .327.

Al (Red) Schoendienst of St. Louis, one of the many frantic chasers of Robinson, had to be content with a third place mark of .328. Gil Hodges, teammate of Robinson, moved to fifth place during the week with a .323.

Rocky Wins, But Gashed

WESTSPRINGFIELD, Mass., July 19 (AP)—Rocky Graziano's 50th victory today appeared to be one of the most costly in his seven-year boxing career.

The former middleweight champion registered his 38th knockout in 64 starts by stopping Joe Agnosta, another New Yorker, in the second round of their scheduled 10-round feature bout last night before a 4500 crowd here in the Century stadium.

But while doing so, Graziano suffered a deep gash over his left eye that, his management said, would sideline him "from three to four weeks."

Graziano suffered the wound early in the first session from what appeared to be an unintentional butt.

Jo-Jo Joins Hollywood

HOLLYWOOD, July 19 (AP)—Joyner (Jo Jo) White has signed up to play ball with the Hollywood Stars, after quitting under fire last week from a rival Pacific Coast league club, the Seattle Rainiers.

Forty-year-old White had managed the Rainiers for two full seasons and parts of two others. He may start at left field for the Stars tonight in a series opener with the Los Angeles Angels.

Manager Fred Haney said last night he plans to alternate Jo Jo in left field with Frankie Kellerer, "at least until Kellerer gets out of his batting slump, and also use him for pinch-hitting and running."

This is White's 22nd year in pro ball. Supposedly he retired as an active player last year. He started his career with minor leagues in the south, moved to the American league's Detroit Tigers, playing with them seven seasons and through two world series.
