

Sea Scouts Keep Busy On Training

The Klamath Sea Scouts, known officially as Sea Scouts Ship 100, are rounding out a three-month period of heavy activity and growth this week with plans proceeding for the treasure hunt scheduled for Upper Klamath lake next month.

The local ship is sponsored by the Klamath Falls Elks lodge.

Skipper Marion Risley pointed out recently that the increase in growth has been exceptionally good. In March, he said, there were only four Sea Scouts.

Today the ship boasts a complement of 41 members, of which more than 30 are official members.

One of the top activities for the summer was climaxed in the winning of the sailboat race in the Junior chamber of commerce sponsored regatta late in June. Two lightning class sailboats took part, winning first and fourth positions.

Previous to the regatta, the Scouts had participated in a Modoc area council rendezvous at Collier State park, and in the Elks parade during their state convention here the Scouts donated a marching unit.

During the Fourth of July activities, the ship was especially active. A Sea Scout color guard led off the parade, with a drum corps providing the martial step.

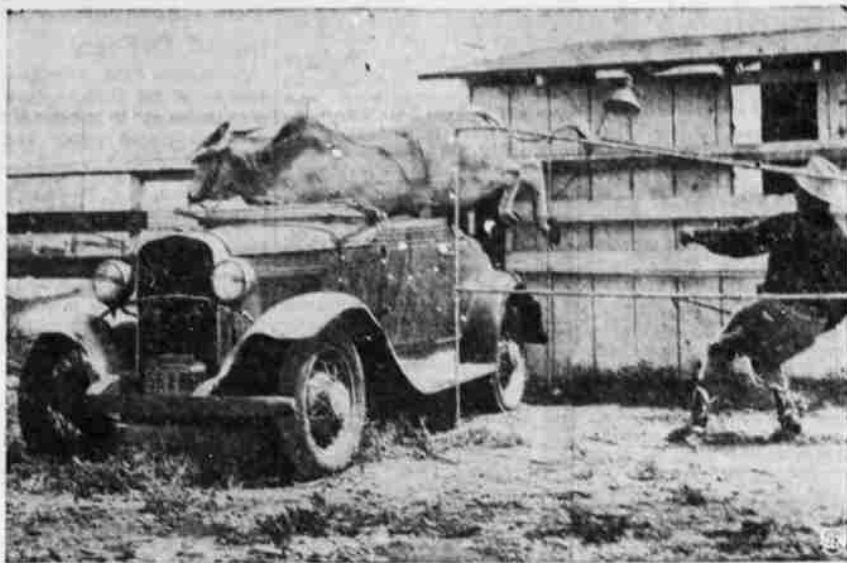
The July Fourth parade saw a float, built by the scouts, and a street full of pirates.

Masons To Constitute New Lodge In Week-End Meeting

Members of the Masonic fraternity will converge on Klamath Falls this coming week-end as the officers of the Grand Lodge of Oregon, A. F. and A. M., hold an occasional grand lodge meeting in the Masonic temple Saturday. Shalor C. Eldridge, grand master, will preside. The meeting will be held for the purpose of constituting the newest Masonic lodge in the state, Crater Lake lodge No. 211.

Initial steps in the formation of the new lodge were taken when organization meetings were held in January and February, 1948. The name Crater Lake was selected and the five top officers were elected. A petition to hold a lodge under dispensation was forwarded to the officers of the grand lodge. The dispensation was granted and the lodge was instituted on May 1, 1948.

At the 1949 annual communication of the grand lodge, held in Portland in June, a charter was granted to Crater Lake lodge and it was assigned No. 211. On June 30, the lodge convened for the purpose of selecting its first officers to serve under charter. The officers

A federal mediator is seeking to settle the dispute between the union and 16 processing laboratories. However, Union President John J. Rally Called In Support Of Elliott

PORTLAND, July 21 (AP)—A public rally in support of Sheriff Mike Elliott has been called for Sunday.

Recall petitions are being circulated against Elliott.

Leaflets distributed yesterday called the meeting for Sunday afternoon in a public park. They said the sponsor was the legal defense movement, an organization known also as the citizens' action committee.

County Democratic Central Committee Chairman Nicholas Grant, who last week said he was Elliott's spokesman in all matters connected with the recall, said he had no knowledge of the rally.

The leaflets urged opposition to "invisible government" that had already put a democratic county treasurer out of office after his election last November. They said the same forces were working to oust the young democratic sheriff.

"For the love of Mike, come and bring your friends," the announcement said.

Meanwhile, Recall Committee Chairman T. L. Gatch, retired vice admiral, said about 2200 signatures on recall election petitions had been sent to county election officials for verification.

were 1013 new cases reported for the nation, compared with 684 the previous week. This is a 49 per cent increase compared with the 43 per cent increase reported last week over the week preceding. This brought to 4895 the total for the whole year through July 16, compared with 3601 during the same period last year—an increase of approximately 1200 cases. During the past week, increases were noted in all major areas. The largest increases were reported from: New York: 72 cases this past week, compared to 16 the week before, with 61 of them being in New York City; Indiana: 52 against 14; Illinois: 55 against 19; and California: 83 against 58.

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CROWN COFFEE BREAD

(Celia Lee Tested Recipe)

Sift Together:
1 1/2 cups sifted Crown Best Patent Flour
2 teaspoons double-acting baking powder
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt

Mix Together:
1 egg, beaten
1/2 cup milk
3 tablespoons melted shortening

Add the liquid ingredients to the dry ingredients, stirring only until well mixed. Pour into greased pan. Cover with crumb topping and bake in moderately hot oven (425°) 25 minutes.

Mix Together:
2 tablespoons melted butter
2 tablespoons sugar
Sprinkle over coffee bread before baking.

CRUMB TOPPING
1/2 cup dry bread crumbs
1 teaspoon cinnamon



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
