Olene Store Remodeled

The E. O. Eggers who have the Olene store and post office have made some large improvements on the appearance of the buildings at this point on the Lakeview highway.

They have remodeled the buildings and made three rental units of the sprawling structures which bordered the highway last year. The units which are faced with composition brick siding have two bedrooms, are insulated and are set back around 60 feet from the highway. The Eggers have landscaped the grounds, planted lawn, built concrete walks from the road to the doors of the houses and generally made an attractive site. They plan further ground improvements as time permits, planting more shrubs and flowers.

The shop constructed of aluminum has been moved to the rear of the other buildings and is being used as a repair shop for mechanical jobs, welding, truck bed and body building and blacksmith work. Steve Pickett operates the business.
