

Individual Action By Solons Best

The Oregon public will be better served by its legislators if the members continue to vote and act as individuals rather than as party members, Chet Irving, Klamath Falls man, told Klamathians Thursday after reporting his experiences as a witness at a congressional hearing in Washington, D. C., where the two-party system is rigidly observed.

Irving's conclusions were based on his observation of congressional tactics in connection with labor legislation. Party politics, rather than what is best for the country, control this situation, the speaker stated.

Irving, manager of the Pine Industrial Relations committee, Inc., said he had observed newspaper comment welcoming the advent of two-party politics in the Oregon legislature. He said he doubted the value of this development, and would prefer seeing Oregon lawmakers continue voting measures on their merits rather than because of their relationship to party politics.

Irving was called to Washington as a witness on a Friday, with the hearing slated for the next Tuesday. He was forced to fly back to get there in time, but the issue got into a wrangle in the house and he was not called until two weeks and two days later. He said the witnesses were given little consideration and were submitted to a partisan ordeal that strayed far from the purpose of their testimony.

The speaker said the Oregon delegation is highly regarded in Washington. Concerning representatives, he said, Stockman is admired for his integrity and stability, Ellsworth for his outstanding ability, Norblad as a comer in legislative circles, and Angell for his defense of the free enterprise system.

Referring to senators, he said Senator Gordon is widely recognized as an expert in the science of government, and "Senator Morse is just Senator Morse."

Irving reviewed the history of labor legislation at the current session and commented that new legislation has failed to make headway, indicating the possibility the Taft-Hartley act will continue in effect for at least two more years.

He was introduced by Sheriff Jack Franey.

Grass Seed Crop Outlook Better

CORVALLIS, July 22 (AP)—Oregon State college crop specialist E. R. Jackman reported today that grass seed crop prospects are better than predicted earlier by growers and dealers.

He said Willamette yields of alta and chewing fescue seed would be close to a normal 250 pounds an acre. This contrasts with earlier estimates that the crop would be down 25-30 per cent.

Drouth in Union county has dropped the grass seed crop yield to one-third or half of normal.

Rye grass acreage was damaged last winter and dropped the production area from the usual 90,000 acres to about 60,000 acres.

Dr. Trotman Speaker At Farm Bureau

Course of the neurological disease called multiple sclerosis was traced through its various stages by Dr. F. E. Trotman in a talk to Farm Bureau women in Merrill Wednesday night.

Dr. Trotman also discussed the many theories now held for its cause. He spoke of the research work in progress on the subject, and how it is being attacked from several angles in medical centers throughout the United States and in other countries.

More deaths occur from multiple sclerosis than from polio, the doctor said. It usually attacks the young adult age group although it may occur at any age. He emphasized the need for increased public knowledge and support to further much-needed work against this disease.

Farm Bureau women are interested in furthering research in this field, and plans are being formulated by the county centers to raise funds for this purpose.

Shipping Of Flour To Japan Slows

WASHINGTON, July 22 (AP)—Additional shipments of flour to Japan "cannot be justified at this time," Senator Cain (R-Wash.) has been told.

Cain had suggested to John P. Loomis, flood administrator for occupied areas, that wheat be milled in the northwest and the flour, instead of wheat, sent to Japan. He said it would aid mills in the Pacific northwest.

Loomis replied, in a letter made public by Cain, that flour shipments have been reduced because wheat can be purchased at a lower cost and processed in Japan without expenditure of dollars and with a saving of the valuable residue of the milling process.

"In view of this fact," Loomis wrote, "additional purchase of flour can hardly be justified if we are to carry out our responsibility of reducing occupation costs to a minimum."

Loomis said it has been necessary for the army to supply approximately 35 per cent of Japan's minimum food needs for its 80 million people and 50 per cent of the requirements of the German people.

"It is only by purchasing insofar as possible unprocessed basic commodities such as wheat that we can obtain the maximum number of calories at a minimum cost," he said. "Flour purchases were necessary for a time because the food stockpile in Japan was so low that there was no time for milling imported grain and flour could be consumed immediately. This is not true, and flour shipments cannot be justified at this time."

HOLLYWOOD, July 22 (AP)—Two six-year-old girls are the first graduates of Mrs. Mollie Britton Dinehart's backyard swimming school—all because of the drowning of a neighbor boy.

Three weeks ago the five-year-old boy was drowned in the pool. Mrs. Dinehart decided the best way to prevent such accidents was to teach the neighborhood children to swim.

She hired Ralph Flannagan a former swimming champ as instructor. The student body averages two to seven years in age.

Aphids Reported In Newberg Area

NEWBERG, July 22 (AP)—An outbreak of aphids on walnuts was reported Thursday by Lloyd Baron, manager of Oregon Nut Growers, Inc.

Baron said a check last Sunday showed two types of the aphids; one on the underside of leaves; the other on the leaf rib. The Oregon State college extension service recommends a 4 per cent nicotine dust against both species.

Some growers believe that aphids may be contributed to the poor quality of nuts in last year's harvest, Baron said.
