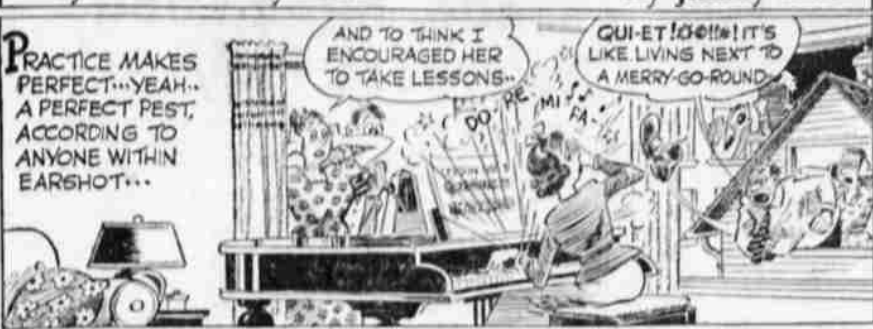

Meat Inspection Said Inadequate

PORTLAND, July 22 (AP)—Dr. Thomas Meador, city health officer, said one fifth of the meat sold in Portland is not adequately inspected. Farm-killed meat comes into the city without proper inspection, he told a civic group. The area outside the city, he said, operates under a federal meat inspection law passed in 1931. The state, Meador added, lacks adequate personnel to enforce "even that law." A possible solution, he said, is public-owned slaughter houses where farmers would have to bring their stock for slaughtering and inspection.

This Drive Is Really Going Over

PRINEVILLE, July 22 (AP)—The Pioneer Memorial Hospital association, which raised \$384,000 in pledge contributions to build a new hospital, is going to make sure it collects. The association was awarded a \$70 judgment against Henry C. Wyatt, the association charged in justice court that Wyatt had pledged \$100 to the hospital fund, and then not made all his payments. Attorney Ralph Brown said some other similar suits might be brought, although no mass suits would be filed, nor attempts made to collect it, hard luck cases. The brick hospital is now being built.
