Students Sign Up For Art Course At OTI

Registration of art students and teachers for the arts and crafts workshop at Oregon Technical Institute is going ahead with over 30 names on the books now at Clayton Burrell's office.

For the past couple of months registration for the summer art classes has been accepted and will continue with a formal registration in person conducted July 28-30 and the first week of the session which will be August 1-31.

Heading the staff is Prof. Emmy Zweybruck, internationally known designer. She will be assisted in the workshop by her daughter, Nora Zweybruck, James Edward Peck, director of art at Cornish school, Seattle, Wash.; Robert Banister, a University of Oregon graduate, supervisor of art in Klamath Falls city schools; and Vern Swanson, artist and architectural designer who has been studying in France and Italy during the past year.

Six hours of elective credit in art may be earned and transferred to any school of the state system of higher education.

Courses offered include, "Special Teaching Methods" (design, composition and textile painting), four hours; "Art Education," two hours and "Lower Division Painting," two hours. These have been approved by Dean Sidney W. Little of the University of Oregon school of architecture and allied arts.

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
