

Tourist Travel Up For Klamath

Klamath tourist travel is up! That's the report from Klamath businessmen who know, and is borne out in figures recently released from Sacramento showing the travel out of Oregon through the various California quarantine stations.

Compared with last year, the month of June upped its count of travelers through the area by 989 cars and 4313 passengers. And, according to the chamber of commerce, July is the big travel month, and the figures are expected to be upped even more by the end of this month.

These figures, however, are from only the southbound traffic that leaves Oregon on highway 97, presumably via Klamath Falls. The northbound travel can only be estimated.

According to Chamber Manager Charlie Stark, travel habits seem to bear out that the average traveler from California enters Oregon by way of US highway 97, and leaves via highway 99, the Pacific highway.

The reason for this may be that 97 is the closest connection with Crater Lake national park. Tourists proceed from there on up to Eugene, Bend, and other northern points, and return southward via the Rogue River valley and Medford.

This may also account for the fact that the Hornbrook station, on US 99, counted almost 3000 more cars heading southward during June than did Dorris.

Tillamook Burn Planting Slated

FOREST GROVE, July 27 (AP)—The actual planting of the Tillamook burn, officially inaugurated last week, will not start until about Nov. 1, Forester R. M. Kallander said today.

Kallander said surveys to determine the most effective seeding methods for different tracts are being made first. Some sections will be planted by air, others by hand. A crew of 25 men will work on the planting through the winter.

Welfare File Probed For Supporters

Investigations got under way yesterday by the county welfare agency preparatory to enforcement of a law passed by the last legislature requiring responsible relatives to contribute set sums to the support of indigent persons.

The law went into effect July 16.

Every welfare case on the county roll is being investigated to determine what relatives, if any, of

each needy person are legally responsible for financial aid.

The investigations will show, Mrs. Altha Urquhart, welfare office supervisor, said, the income of responsible relatives and the law sets up a scale of payments those relatives will be forced to make, based on income and the number of persons dependent on that income.

The new law defines "responsible relatives" as a living husband, wife, father, mother, son or daughter, and gives the welfare agency authority to require statements under oath from applicants for relief and from responsible relatives concerning income and financial condition.

Oregon law in the past has required some measure of responsibility from relatives of persons on welfare rolls, but the new law sets a scale of payments required and

also makes such payments mandatory.

Persons refusing or failing to contribute to the care of needy relatives may be prosecuted by the welfare agency, under terms of the law, and judgements for money due under the responsibility scale may be obtained in court. Recipients of welfare are made parties with the welfare agency in court actions under the law.

Each person being investigated by the county welfare agency will receive a copy of the law and an affidavit of income and financial responsibility.

Marine Terminal Wins Go-Ahead

PORTLAND, July 27 (AP)—Approval of municipal marine terminal No. 4 for nitrate loading is viewed by the city dock commission as a step toward this port becoming a major ammonium nitrate shipping point.

The nitrate is being moved by the army from the Midwest to Korea and Japan for fertilizer. At present it is routed through Gulf ports.

Special approval of the facilities here was required because of the explosive nature of the cargo. The Texas City disaster was touched off from a ship loaded with ammonium nitrate.

The terminal is located near the idle Oregon shipyard and well north of the major harbor area.

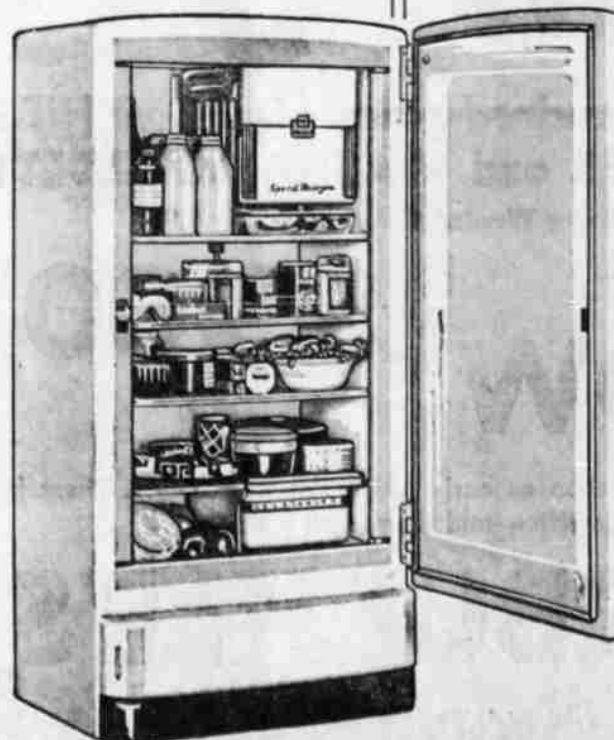
