Doe-Kills Banned In Entire State, Commission Intimates

Dr. George H. Adler, returning from Portland and an appearance before the state game commission, reported that there probably will be no doe kills in the entire state this year.

He is chairman of the local Klamath Sportsmen's association, an organization which annually has gone to bat against doe kills of the type which have in the past been sanctioned for Lake and other counties.

The game commission has made no provision for any special doe seasons this fall and has set the regular deer season for the first 20 days in October.

The commission likewise, Dr. Adler pointed out, said there will be a dove season for this area unless prevented by the government, although no provisions for such a season were written into the 1949 hunting regulations.

Last year the commission and finally the governor turned Klamath county down on a dove season.
