Chapman Is America's Only Hope

SAINT JOHN, N. B., July 28 (AP)—America's hopes in the Canadian amateur golf championships rested with Dick Chapman as play entered the quarter-finals today.

The Pinehurst, N. C., veteran became the only U. S. survivor after yesterday's expulsion of defending champion Frank Stranahan of Toledo, Ohio. Tommy Riddell, Quebec amateur king, ended the muscular American's two-year reign, one up in 19 holes.

Chapman, 1940 American amateur champion and 1947 runnerup for the British amateur title, had little trouble getting past the two 18-hole rounds yesterday. He first defeated Doug Bajus, Vancouver, 4 and 2, then took his afternoon match from Vern Mohs, Edmonton, Alberta, 6 and 4.

Another American casualty was Denver's John Kraft, who lost a one-up morning decision to 16-year-old Laurie Roland, junior champion of British Columbia.

The small but chubby Riddell meets another tough opponent today in Bill Mawhinney of Vancouver, B. C., rated Canada's best bet in the tournament. Mawhinney won his fourth round match at the expense of George Eluck, Windsor, Ont., 2 and 1.

Teen-Agers Set Golf Sights High

WASHINGTON, July 28 (AP)—A dazzling 60 set by Blammin' Sammy Sneed this spring is the target for today as the national junior golf championship meet enters the second round.

The teen-age golfers may have set their sights a bit high but there was evidence in yesterday's opening round that the mark is well within reach. Sneed, incidentally, made his 60 on the Congressional club course when it was in better shape than it is now.

Unheralded youngster from Dayton, Ohio, who took the 6350, par-71 course for a four-under 67 may equal Sneed's score.
