## Flag Testing Last Wrinkle In Washington

WASHINGTON, July 29 (AP)—The star spangled banner—long may she wave.

That's the goal of a research project undertaken by the public buildings administration, which buys flags for more than 1300 buildings at a cost of about \$15,000 a year.

The average cotton-and-wool hunting flag lasts 27 days. Buildings Commissioner W. E. Reynolds told reporters. The flags fade and tear more quickly in winter than in summer, and some areas are harder on flags than others. On buildings in the windy, foggy San Francisco bay area, for example, at least one new flag must be installed every day, Reynolds said.

Flag testers will work with many different materials, with plastic and with various types of stitching.

Last winter, for the first time, a nylon flag was tested. It was flown from the new interior building for 76 days, a record for that season.

Nylon costs about twice as much as standard bunting, however.

## Alpine Lodge Open Now

DUNSMUIR, July 29—The Shasta Alpine lodge at the timberline on Mt. Shasta is now open for the season. It is maintained by the Sierra club of San Francisco for those who wish to climb the mountain or just visit the place.

E. Richards is the custodian. There are three cabins available this summer, with a limited supply of bedding. The kitchen has been equipped so that meals can be served to small parties.

Richards said he would like to have advance notice from groups who plan to come. He has stocked a few items of special use to climbers. His address is general delivery, Mt. Shasta. He comes to town once a week on Fridays.

## Oregon Cop To Aid In Germany

SALEM, July 29 (AP)—Salem Police Lt. Farley Morgan of State will fly to Germany Saturday to serve 60 days as a special supervisor of German police.

Morgan, a lieutenant colonel in the army during World War II, was chief of public safety for the army in Germany and was head of the German civil police from the end of the war until the summer of 1947.

## WALTHY

LONDON, July 29 (AP)—The late Lord Portal of Laverstoke, who directed the 1948 Olympic games, left an estate of 2,122,338 pounds (\$8,488,903).

His will made public Thursday, bequeathed it to his widow. Elected president of the British Olympic association in 1936, Lord Portal was host to athletes of 62 nations here last year.

He was Britain's minister of works in 1942 and was a director of numerous companies.
