US Consul In Yugoslavia Dies

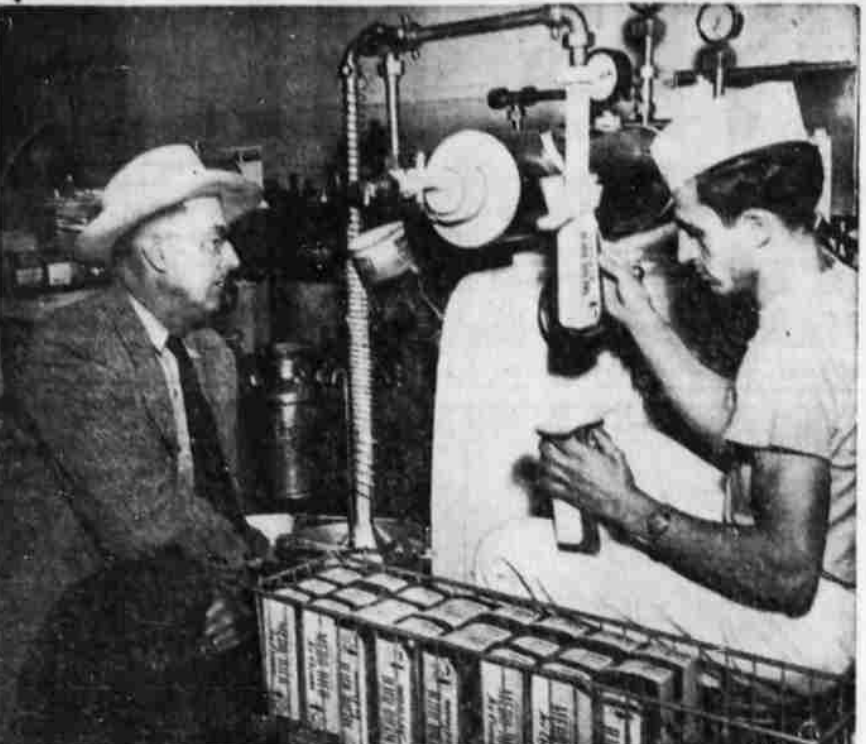
