

# NSI Forms Available On August 29th

Application blanks for the \$2,000,000 national service life insurance special dividend to be paid to some 18,000,000 present and former policyholders will be available for veterans August 29, the veterans administration has announced.

Government printing office currently is running off 70,000,000 of the forms, advance samples of which have been released. The forms will be available in every post office, VA office and at veterans' service organizations beginning August 29, which is the earliest date the government printing office can complete distribution of the huge order.

The first phase of the huge insurance dividend operation is virtually completed, the VA said. High speed microfilming machines are completing the job of photographing the last group of more than 22,000,000 premium record cards. Only the V-mail program during the war topped the VA project in volume.

## Youngster Appeals To Idaho Boss

BOISE, Idaho, Aug. 1 (AP)—A boy from Midvale appealed to Gov. C. A. Hubbs for help in getting out of a financial difficulty.

This printed letter to the governor read: "I am in serious trouble. I caught and delivered \$100 worth of magpie heads, thinking this promised money was good, backed by the state of Idaho."

"I mortgaged this expected money to buy a hunting knife. I can't pay for this knife, which I need every day. What can I do in this matter. I am 8 years old."

"Yours truly, Billy Youngs." The governor passed the letter on to the fish and game department which handles the state bounty on magpies.

## Boy Killed In Cop-Robber Game

TILLAMOOK, Aug. 1 (AP)—A Tillamook county ward, 9-year-old Dean Moore, was fatally wounded Saturday while playing cops-and-robbers with a surplus army rifle.

County Coroner Allen Lundberg said the boy and George Akers, 10, obtained the gun in the absence of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Humfleet from their farm home near Garibaldi.

The gun was dropped and discharged, the bullet penetrating the youngster's arm and side. He succumbed before a physician arrived. The Akers lad and a younger brother, Kenneth, age 8, were county wards assigned to the care of the Humfleets.

## Dollar-a-Month Club Demo Plan

PORTLAND, Aug. 1 (AP)—The state democratic executive committee has okayed a dollar-a-month club to help swell the party's political coffers.

The plan was proposed by Chairman Austin Flegel during sessions Saturday.

The committee also overhauled the party's state constitution. The basic change was a revision allowing mail balloting of state central committee members on party issues, but only if a majority of the officers or of the executive committee call for the ballot.

conference, which ended Friday night, was to give the interior department's "refresher" course in latest techniques and developments.

Said Dr. Harry J. Isaacs, a Chicago medical school executive and internal medicine specialist, as the session ended: "These A.N.S. doctors are wonders. They must be able to perform all sorts of operations in emergencies. The post-graduate courses should be of immense value to them. We found them very fine doctors, very conscientious and anxious to increase their knowledge in order to be of greater value to their communities."

In turn, the native service doctors recommended that the course be held again next year, and that it coincide with the annual meeting of the Alaska Medical Association at Mt. McKinley National Park hotel.

It was the first time that military medical officers participated in the

conference, although three have been held previously.

The air force flew the native service doctors here from throughout Alaska. To allow the doctors to leave their isolated posts, the air force also brought north seven reserve medical corps officials to fill in for them.

En route back to the states, the specialists and reserve officers will stop at Mount Edgecumbe Orthopedic hospital, in wartime navy facilities outside Sitka. They also will be guests of Gov. Ernest Gruening at the executive mansion in Juneau.

The versatile medical men from frontier villages, who have to be masters of plumbing as well as masters of medicine, went through an intensive study course under experts in fields ranging from gynecology to ophthalmology.
