



THE WEATHER IN YOUR POCKET—Going on a picnic tomorrow? Just whip out this handy weather predictor and get the latest lowdown on what's coming up. The girl at right simply turns dial that aligns a red arrow with picture of cloud formation and wind direction and produces the correct weather forecast for the next 12 to 24 hours in the small window at top. Clouds in the sky are matched with one of the seven colored pictures of cloud formations on the face of the instrument, close-up at left. The predictor was developed by Dr. Irving P. Krick of the American Institute of Aerological Research.

Embezzler To Serve Year-And-A-Day

NEW YORK, Aug. 4 (AP)—A Washington state man was sentenced to a year and a day Wednesday on his guilty plea to embezzling \$51,000 in U. S. funds while a civilian employee on an army transport.

He was Frank J. Forster, 31, of Tacoma, whose guilty plea last May involved his service as a civilian disbursing officer on the US-

AT Private Francis X. McGraw, Federal Judge Gaston L. Porter also imposed a three-year probation period to follow the prison term.

Forster is currently serving a six month sentence for embezzlement of an additional \$14,000 in government funds. He told the government he had spent most of the money on "high living" in New York and abroad.

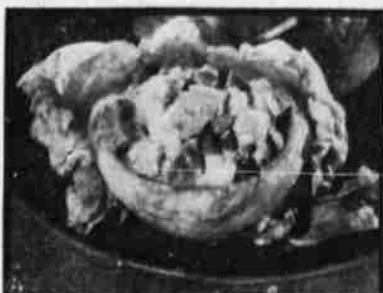
