

Prague Court Sends Priest To Prison

PRAGUE, Aug. 4 (AP)—The official Prague radio announced Wednesday that the state court has sentenced a Roman Catholic priest to eight years in prison for high treason for refusing to administer the last sacrament to an old woman because she was a communist.

This was the first such sentence in the communist government's war with the Roman Catholic hierarchy. The communist minister of justice, Alexei Cepicka, threatened two weeks ago to prosecute for treason any Roman Catholic clergyman who attempted to carry out the Vatican decree calling for excommunication of communists or denial of the sacraments to those who aid communists.

The court sentenced the Rev. Alois Fajet to eight years and ordered confiscation of all his property along with 10 years loss of civil rights. His parish is at Sebranice, east of Prague.

The radio announcement and the official Czech press bureau said Father Fajet refused the last rites to Zofie Pacikova, 67, who "was fighting death of pneumonia."

Post Office Keeping Busy

Business at the post office this summer is fairly light although the usual run of mail with the added tourist correspondence keeps officials busy.

More postcards keep coming into the office every day — some of which are relegated to the waste-paper basket because they lack proper addresses. No postcards are returned to the sender even if return address is given.

All letters, which are undeliverable and cannot be returned, go to the dead letter file in Portland where they are opened and examined for valuables. All valuables are kept for a year before they are sent to the post office department. Officials report that few inquiries are made for lost money and letters.

Ryegrass Seed Estimate Up

PORTLAND, Aug. 4 (AP)—Seed producers Tuesday revised ryegrass seed crop predictions for Oregon upward by ten million pounds.

A survey indicated a harvest of more than 40,000,000 pounds. This compares with an earlier prediction of 30,000,000 pounds and last year's total harvest of 27,000,000 pounds.

Linn county growers, who produce much of the crop, credited favorable weather plus extensive use of chemical fertilizer and weed killers. They said the application of the weed and fertilizer chemicals helped the crop recover from a hard winter.

Market sources said producer prices were 9 1/4 to 9 cents a pound.

USBR Got Little Power Firm Money

SPOKANE, Aug. 4 (AP)—Only seven per cent of the national reclamation association's funds came from power companies last year, the association president said Tuesday, and that was received "indirectly."

Harry E. Polk, Williston, N. D., told a chamber of commerce gathering that the money from power companies was received through their contributions to state reclamation associations.

Railroads, Polk said, contributed about 20 per cent of the budget. He said his remarks were in answer to charges by Rep. Jackson (D-Wash.) that the association was "dominated financially" by private power companies.

Sample To Conduct Portland Symphony

PORTLAND, Aug. 4 (AP)—James Sample, former associate conductor of the San Francisco symphony, will conduct the Portland symphony orchestra this season.

He was selected from 20 applicants to run the "shoestring symphony." The musicians this year offered to gamble on gate receipts for their salaries, after the symphony society failed to get enough donations to assure the normal arrangements.

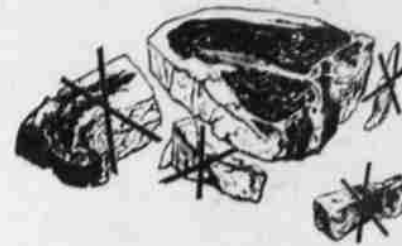

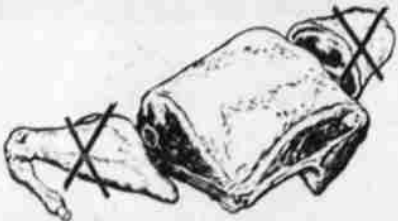
