Today's Roundup

STARTLING. Indeed, was Frank Belgrano's blast at the national leadership of the American Legion in a speech at Salem yesterday where the state department is in session.

Mr. Belgrano's standing in the Legion as a past national commander and in the state as head of a large financial institution gives special significance to his remarks, and the repercussions will be widespread and intense. What he has said creates a national situation in the Legion, and may well reverberate in the halls of congress.

It is difficult to believe that Mr. Belgrano would make the charges if he were not sure of his ground. The first reaction among local Legionnaires, however, was to express loyalty to the organization's national leadership. It is a situation that needs a thorough airing, in the Legion and for the benefit of the interested public.

MY own personal contacts with the Legion have extended over a quarter of a century, as a newspaper man observing the organization's work and reporting its activities to the public. They have been confined almost entirely, of course, to the local post level, and on that basis, I have the highest regard for the organization, its objectives, and the service it has rendered. My general observations, as a newspaper and magazine reader, of the organization nationally, have been along the same line, but I, like many others, am not in a position to judge accurately Mr. Belgrano's criticisms.

Locally, attention should be called to the services rendered by the Klamath post to World War II veterans which largely were responsible for the post winning a cup last year as the outstanding post in the state department. The criticisms were clearly aimed at the national leadership, and certainly do not apply to the local organizations such as the several posts in the Klamath basin, which are doing good work. This writer, for one, has developed a favorable opinion of the work of all the recognized veteran units operating here.

Story Of Two Neckties

GAVE Red Hurd a couple of neckties yesterday. It wasn't his birthday and he may not have needed the ties, but he's a good guy and he happened to be sitting at his typewriter when I dug the colorful strips of cloth out of an old drawer where I had put them two or three years ago.

It happened this way: One day through the mail came a package addressed to me, and when I opened it, there were the ties. The outfit that sent them suggested that I accept them and please remit; otherwise, to send them back.

I happened to be pretty busy at the time. It was my full intention to send them back, because I don't like that way of merchandising, but it was an annoyance and the "opportunity" wholly uninvited on my part. I tossed the ties in the drawer.

Later I got a sharp reminder from the people who had sent them, which warmed me up just a bit. I put off doing anything about it, and just plumb forgot. About that time I changed offices and desks, and it wasn't until yesterday, when going through a drawer in the old desk, that I ran onto them. I felt I couldn't honestly wear them myself, I had long since lost the name and address of the people who had sent them, and Red got the ties. My conscience told me that under the circumstances, I had a right to give them away.

It was further eased when Frank Jenkins came along and reported he had read recently a legal interpretation which held that people receiving

merchandise under such circumstances are not legally or morally bound to return it or to do anything about it. They didn't order the stuff, and folks who send neckties and things around in that way have no right to expect either money or returns. That clears the way for Red Hurd to sport the haberdashery in full legal brilliance.

These Days

DON'T know John Maragon, except what I read in the newspapers. I can deal objectively, without bias or partisanship, without friendship or enmity, with the phrase, "Greek bootblack."

Apparently, whenever his name is mentioned, it seems to be necessary for the snots to emphasize that this fellow is not of the Groton-Harvard crowd, but that he must be a low creature because he is now opulent but was once a "Greek bootblack." We used to be proud of the fact that in the United States there was no aristocracy of birth but rather equality of opportunity under a system of private enterprise. That was when our children read Horatio Alger rather than "Grapes of Wrath," and when they knew if they worked hard, saved their money, developed flexible minds and assumed wholesome risks, they would come out on top.

Albert Hubbard glorified the university of Hard Knocks where newsboys, office boys, bootblacks, clerks, etc., became the Carnegies, Rockefellers, Wanamakers, Edisons and other captains of commerce and industry who built this country, gave us our rich standard of living, left fortunes for their heirs and to charity, provided the huge productivity which a profligate government has been squandering. Few of these substantial citizens had the advantage of ivy league colleges and none of them assumed that horrible imitation of an Oxford accent which I have been listening to at Tanglewood where the intellectuals gather to compare Stravinsky to Brahms and find Stravinsky good.

The Age's Unreality

HOW far have we moved from reality that we hold it against a man that he started life as a bootblack, managed to move up the ladder and used his intelligence, rather than inherited wealth and family prestige, to get along? I have seen no names of "Greek bootblacks" on the list of traitors, conspirators, spies, and wreckers of their country, but the ivy league and imitation Oxford accent have contributed more than their share and as the story unfolds, it is increasingly evident that those who are too refined to be useful are not always too decent to be unparitotic.

This outcry against the so-called five-percenters is part of the unreality of our age. The bureaucrats dialke the five-percenters, but if there were a full investigation of commission agents—which is what they are—and fixers and introduction-sellers in Washington, it would be found that the brighter new deal lawyers have set themselves up in this business. They do not call their fees commissions; they call them retainers. If an ex-army officer sets himself up in this business—and it is a legitimate business—he is subject to every kind of smear and investigation, but the relations between a lawyer and his client are confidential in a world in which all the laws are written, interpreted and judged by lawyers. So the lawyers get away with getting rich as commission agents through retainers but object to anyone else making an honest dollar in an honest business.

How It Works

LET me show you what I mean: A fellow in a small town has the energy, enterprise, foresight and opportunity to establish a radio station. He has the money to go ahead. But he discovers that a radio station cannot be established like a grocery store. The government has a monopoly of the air-waves, of licenses, of channels, of the size and power of these stations. He finds that this is a very complicated business. So he goes to his local lawyer. His local lawyer usually tells him that this is a specialty which he cannot handle, but if his client is willing to pay the price, he will aid him in getting a Washington law firm that specializes in FCC business. The client says go ahead and the fees are paid and in time he gets a license. It costs plenty. If the citizen tried to handle it without the specialists, it would cost more in time, energy, aggravation and traveling expenses.

If the lawyers can set up this convenience at a fee, why cannot an ex-army officer or an ex-bootblack? I am not discussing crooks, bribe-givers and such. I am discussing honest commission agents.

QUESTION: A friend 56 years old has cramp-like pains in one leg. What could be the cause of this and what could be done for it?

ANSWER: The description is meager but if the cramp-like pains come only after exercise, the most likely diagnosis is "intermittent claudication," a condition which is caused by poor circulation due to hardening of the arteries in the leg. Treatment is often not too successful.
