Vet's Mail Bag

As a service to veterans in the community this newspaper will publish an occasional column of news briefs from the veterans administration. For further information veterans should contact or write their nearest VA office.

Veterans planning to attend school this fall under the G.I. bill are advised by the veterans administration to make certain their certificates of eligibility are in order.

If a veteran is attending school last spring or this summer under the G.I. bill, and intends to continue in the same school and course this fall, his present certificate of eligibility on file with the VA is valid. There is no need for him to contact the VA about a certificate.

If he intends to continue in the same school but in a different course, he should see his school's registrar to learn whether the institution requires a supplemental certificate of eligibility.

If a veteran is not now in school, and holds an unused certificate of eligibility issued by the VA before September 1, 1948, he should exchange it now for a new type certificate, if he plans to take a course this fall.

The veteran who has no certificate of any kind should apply for one at his nearest VA office, if he intends to enroll in school for the fall term. He will be issued the new type certificate when the VA determines that he meets the necessary eligibility requirements.

Question of the Week: Q. My husband, a World War I veteran, died of a non-service connected ailment. Am I eligible for a pension? A. You may be eligible if you were married to the veteran prior to December 14, 1944; your income does not exceed the limitation established by law, and your late husband's service meets the requirements of the law.

Forward Buying, Building Spurt Slows US Recession

NEW YORK, Aug. 6 (AP)—Forward buying by businessmen and a spurt in home building lessened the impact of the recession this week.

There were many indications the declining economy was leveling off in some fields, at least temporarily. Earl R. Muir, president of the Louisville, Ky., Trust company and a spokesman for the American Bankers association, put it this way:

"We are going through a very fine period of readjustment. We are getting better productivity from labor which has reduced building costs. Retail business has been lowering its inventories."

He noted some slight pickup other than seasonal. He said there can be no real depression when prospective purchasers have some \$175,000,000,000 in savings and bank deposits.

Economists thought business probably would hold at mid-year levels through September; that at the end of the quarter there might be a turn upward.

But they felt employment and production might start downward again in the closing months of the year and continue a declining course until mid-1950.

Some of the week's optimism was based on a rise in business loans, the first in 28 weeks. The increase brought the total of business loans by banks to \$12,891,000,000.

It was a small increase—only \$16,000,000—and it was an overdue seasonal reaction brought on as business borrowed to build up stocks for the fall and Christmas seasons.
