

Investigators Probe Cause Of Bus Crash

BLOOMINGTON, Ind., Aug. 11 (AP)—Three crews of investigators studied charred fragments of a Greyhound bus today in an attempt to learn why it carried 15 persons to flaming death yesterday.

An even grimmer investigation moved slowly ahead at an emergency morgue in the national guard armory. There weary officials and dazed relatives tried to identify the last of the bodies of the victims.

Five remained unidentified.

Investigators for the Interstate Commerce Commission, Indiana state police and Greyhound lines were going through the wreckage in the Greyhound garage in Indianapolis.

They would say little, but Superintendent Arthur M. Thurston of state police said that a preliminary examination had disclosed "No evidence of mechanical failure."

Earlier, Driver Wayne Cranmer, 25, Indianapolis, had said, "It seemed like the steering gear went out."

The tragedy was three-fold in one family. The list of identified dead included a mother and her two children.

One survivor, Sgt. Dale Aikman, 30, Camp Campbell, Ky., was in critical condition. His wife and two children were among the dead.

Mrs. Arminta Brown, 61, Indianapolis, one of those killed, was the mother of the late Wild Bill Cummings, who won the 1934 Indianapolis motor speedway 500-mile race and was killed just 10 years ago in a traffic accident. He was married, Homer G. Brown, 35, also died in the wreck.

'Bait Jail' Backbone Of New Business

BRADENTON, Fla. (AP)—William L. Aldridge Sr., retired Dunn, N. C. manufacturer, couldn't stay retired so he and his son have opened a sporting goods store here. One of the reasons was his development of what he calls a "bait jail," a container for holding bait while fishing and for keeping it alive better.

It is a metal rectangle with flexible arms which fit into slotted steel holders. The holders are fastened to the boat and the container can be slipped in and out in a jiffy. The arms permit the bait to remain half submerged when the boat is at anchor and a single row of holes on all four sides permits the water to flow freely in and out. When the craft is in motion, the arms permit it to rise higher and vibrate behind the boat. A scoop in the bottom picks up sufficient water to keep the bait alive.

Bidding Pays Off With Free Gift

LONDON (AP)—Six British museums bid \$168,000 for paintings by artist and poet William Blake at an art auction and then got them for nothing.

A secret clause in the will of the late Graham Robertson, London playwright who collected Blake's works, specified that "institutions serving the public should have free the works for which they were prepared to pay considerable sums."

The sale of Robertson's collection of paintings by the 19th century artist brought a total of \$246,396. Those not taken by museums and art galleries were bought by private collectors.
