## Farm Experts Eye Hopper Invasions

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15 (AP)—Agriculture field men have been assigned to grasshopper infested areas in Oregon, Rep. Stockman (R-Ore.) said today.

He told a reporter the department has assured him that sufficient funds will be made available for the control work there. The department's experts, he added, believe the state can be protected from any further invasion of the particular type of insect that has plagued the state this year. He said

the department reported no further extensive migrations of grasshoppers from Wyoming and Montana, where he said most of the insects originated this year.
