German Eyes Equatorial Ski Trek

FRANKFURT, Germany—Robert Hildebrand wants to ski down the equator.

He has the places all picked out. They are the snow-covered peaks of Mt. Ruwenzori in British East Africa and Mt. Kilimandscharo in what used to be German East Africa.

Hildebrand, a German mountaineer, has been to both before. He was a member of a German exploration party that claims to have made the first ascent to Ruwenzori's peak, in 1937.

Why these East African mountains? Well, there is something fascinating about these equatorial peaks. Once seen, you want to see them again, he explains.

You reach the foothills with a typical jungle safari in steaming weather. Then you start climbing and you are in the snow.

Hildebrand has climbed the Matterhorn and Mt. Blanc but still prefers East Africa.

Ruwenzori is 16,000 feet high. From a map it appears that it slopes down directly across the equator. Kilimandscharo is farther south but in the equatorial region.

"Anybody with good equipment and a good heart can climb them," says Hildebrand.
