

Forest Service Camp Area In Basin Area Not Under "Fee For Camping" Ruling

None of the three forest service camping grounds in the Klamath district require fees for overnight camping. All three of the camping grounds in this 70 mile long district are at Lake o' the Woods. One picnic area where no camping is allowed is also located there.

The forest service here has information only on forest service camps in the state. However, information on state camps and national parks may be secured from the state department or from the national park office in Medford. Camping is seldom allowed in the state parks, however.

The fee system has been tried in nine forest parks in the state with reported success. A small fee of 50 cents per car for a day or \$3 per week is charged. Not more than six adults per car is allowed. For this fee the forest service supplies wood and disposes of garbage. In these parks a fee of 25 cents per day

for a party of six adults is charged for picnicking.

The fee was used this year so that the government might obtain some return on the forest service invest-

ment and to assure campers in those camps of better service. Several camps in the Rogue river area have a fee system. They are Dead Indian Soda springs and the McKee bridge camping area. The ones with the most success seem to be Clear Lake and Paradise camps on the Willamette river, according to the forest service here.

In a few camps the site has been leased to individuals who charge a fee for profit in return for service to the campers and maintenance of

the park. This venture is an experiment to see what best benefits the service and the public.

All land belongs to the forest service and is leased by individuals on a yearly basis for private use. In such places as the Lake o' the Woods, which is in the forest service district, all improvements such as buildings belong to the leasee. However, the Rocky Point lodge resort was built by the forest service and it, as well as the land, is leased yearly to the operator.

A list of improved public camps of the national forests of Oregon is available at the forest service office in the post office building. A similar list of other states may be secured from forest service offices there.

PRESERVED EGGS

Eggs have been preserved by treating them with carbon dioxide and nitrogen. The treatment is said to preserve them for a period of one year.

LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y., Aug. 18 (AP)—The world's fast-growing population doesn't doom it to a lower standard of living, Interior Secretary J. A. Krug declared Wednesday. Science, he said, can "find and develop food, fuels and materials" to boost living standards everywhere. Krug spoke at the opening of the

United Nations scientific conference on the conservation and utilization of resources. It brings together 700 scientists from 50 nations.

"I do not side with those who 'bleat with alarm' the increasing world population and the decreasing reserves of some things which now appear to be essential to our way of living," Krug said.
