ONTARIO, Ore., Aug. 19.—(P) Malheur county's second case of polio this year was reported yesterday just as this city was sprayed with DDT for the second time this season.

The polio case was that of a nine-year-old girl living south of Nyssa. She was taken to a Boise hospital with a mild case of bulbar polio.

This city has not had a case for three years. Last week residents raised money to finance continued spraying with DDT thought to be a deterrent to spread of the disease.
