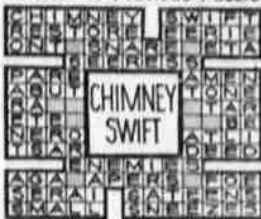

SEATTLE, Aug. 22 (AP)—Reduction of the state bounties for seal and sea lions was announced Saturday as an economy move.

State Fisheries Director Alvin Anderson said the payments in the predator control program will drop from \$8 to \$3 apiece after September 1. He said two salaried seal hunters also are being dropped by the department.

Anderson estimated a saving of \$25,000 to the state.
