

Did Man's Nightmare Cause Him To Murder Wife, Take Own Life?

GRAND MARAIS, Minn., Aug. 25 (AP)—The bodies of a vacationing Nebraskan who apparently hanged and strangled his wife to death during a nightmare and then took his own life with poison were being returned to Omaha today.

J. Henry Ellason, Cook county attorney, identified the victims as Lloyd N. Osborne, 58, an Omaha real estate man, and his 47-year-old wife, Helen.

There bodies were found yesterday in the cabin of a resort 35 miles north of here along the Gunflint trail, where the Osbornes had been vacationing with other members of the family since Friday.

In a note found near his body, Ellason said Osborne wrote: "I must have had a nightmare. I didn't realize what I had done to Helen. This is the way out."

The note ended in a scrawl as the yet unidentified poison potion took effect.

Ellason gave this version of the double killing:

The Osborne couple discussed the case of Jake Bird, state of Washington axe slayer recently executed, after retiring Tuesday night. Later, Osborne got up, took a hatchet from the cabin woodbox and hit his wife in the head several times. Then he knotted his pajama bottoms about her neck.

A neighbor reported hearing a woman scream just once shortly before 2 a. m. yesterday but went to sleep when there was no further noise. David Osborne, 19, a son, discovered the bodies when maids seeking to do up the cabin reported the door wouldn't open.

David forced entry to find the pajama-clad body of his stepmother. His father, fully clothed, lay on the bed. While writing the note, Osborne made out several checks to pay bills and others for his son.

Coastal Area Expects Horde Of Fishermen

ASTORIA, Ore., Aug. 25 (AP)—This coastal region braced itself today for a horde of sports fishermen, expected to start arriving this week-end for the annual salmon derbies.

Some 10,000 sportsmen are to crowd the Columbia river for the five derbies that wind up on Labor Day.

The opening event is the mayor's derby at Ilwaco, Wash., with the chief executives of 21 cities entered. Both that and the Astoria Yacht club derby are held this week-end.

The \$2000 Astoria salmon derby, along with two smaller contests sponsored by the towns of Warrenton and Hammond, runs from August 30 to Labor Day.

\$74,926,000 For Northwest Defense Work

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25 (AP)—A bill authorizing defense construction totaling \$62,602,000 in Alaska and \$12,324,000 in Washington state was approved by the Senate armed services committee yesterday. Senator Cain (R-Wash.) announced.

He listed the following proposed expenditures:

Washington—Seattle, \$211,000; Whidbey Island, \$28,000 for enlarging naval air station; Tacoma, \$200,000 for purchase of General Petroleum company's terminal No. 2 for air force; Moses Lake air force base, \$5,230,000 for expansion; Spokane, \$6,645,000 for expansion of air force base.

Alaska—Anchorage, \$22,616,000 for navy defense installations; Kodiak naval air station, \$2,548,000, runway extensions and additional quarters for personnel; Ladd field, Fairbanks, \$3,610,000, extension of fighter squadron facilities and establishment of a cold weather test detachment; Eielson air force base, Fairbanks, \$28,126,200, additional plane and personnel facilities; Ft. Richardson, \$3,644,000.

Details of the approved Alaska projects were withheld for security reasons, Cain said.
