

Vet Insurance Refund Forms Due Aug. 29

August 29 has been officially set as the date for veterans to pick up their forms of application for refund of overpayment on GI insurance premiums.

The forms will be distributed from the post office to other points in the city, where veterans will pick them up.

The forms are the first step for veterans to apply for their insurance dividends, three billion dollars of which is to be divided among approximately 17 million veterans.

According to Veteran Service Officer Ted Case, survivors of veterans who died after their insurance elapsed are also eligible for the dividends, but must wait until separate forms are procured, presumably by the office of the veterans administration here.

Armistice Day post of the VPW has arranged to handle the distribution of the dividend forms at Oregon Technical Institute.

A recent case of a black widow spider bite in Klamath Falls has been called to the attention of County Health Officer Dr. Seth Kerron, who today issued a warning to Klamath people to be on guard against spiders.

While Dr. Kerron said there is no reason for alarm or to expect a deluge of the insects, he added that it is wise to be on the lookout in case there are any more around.

Black widow spider bites are not often fatal, the doctor said, but the result from a bite is extreme pain and severe illness, which must be treated by a physician.
