

Storm Tossed Plane, 49 Aboard, Lands

YOUNGSTOWN, O., Aug. 29 (AP)—A Northwest Airlines plane carrying 46 passengers and three crewmen made a safe emergency landing here before dawn today.

Two passengers were injured slightly, and there was little, if any, damage to the plane.

The four-engine DC-4, which left LaGuardia field in New York at 11:35 p.m. (EST) en route to Seattle, ran into rough weather near Allentown, Pa., and radioed ahead to Youngstown municipal airport to arrange for an emergency landing. The scheduled flight, No. 501, called for the first stop at Detroit.

Three fire companies from Youngstown and two from Warren, along with the field's crash equipment crew stood by while the big liner came in for a landing at 2:15 a.m. (EST).

A woman and two boy passengers were taken to a Warren hospital, but none was hurt seriously.

The airliner pilot, Alan Ackerson of Hazel, N. J., said his plane ran into "one of the roughest storms I have ever been in." Ackerson has been an airlines pilot for seven years. He said he flew by instruments for the last part of the flight.

Webster Wins At Pendleton; Records Fall

PENDLETON, Aug. 29 (AP)—Choate Webster of Nowata, Okla., roped and dogged his way to the all-around cowboy championship of the 38th annual Pendleton Roundup here Saturday.

His title wins in both the steer roping and bulldogging finals gave the Oklahoma his first claim on the \$5000 Sam Jackson roped and a big share of the \$38,000 money.

Webster barely edged out Bud Linderman, Red Lodge, Mont., who rode to championships in both bareback and saddle bronc riding. Webster piled up 1150 points compared with Linderman's 1100 total.

It was Webster's second year of competition here. His time for roping three steers was 63.9 seconds and he brought his three bulls to a halt in 40.9. A fast bulldogging time of 7.9 seconds for one animal helped give him the edge over veterans Glen Tyler, Modesto, Calif., and Homer Pettigrew, Chandler, Ariz.

Two records were posted in the four day rodeo.

Ben Johnson, Sun Valley, Calif., doped a calf in 12.5 seconds. It broke the 13-second time set in 1941. The other top performance was by Gene Rambo, Shandon, Calif., in bulldogging. He brought a steer to ground in 7.8 seconds.

International Rodeo association points picked up by Rambo kept the California cowpoke in the lead for the association's world champion title.

A crowd of 14,000 was on hand for the final day.

One Northwesterner—Deb Copenhagen of Preston, Wash., placed in the championship events. He was third in saddle bronc riding.

Sheriff Recall Test Nearing

PORTLAND, Aug. 29 (AP)—Sponsors of a recall aimed at Multnomah County Sheriff M. L. Elliott report they need but 5000 more signatures on the special election petitions.

4 Week-End Drownings In Oregon

Four persons drowned in outing mishaps in Oregon over the past week-end.

A Portland youth drowned while swimming in the Clackamas river, a Waldport lad was pulled under the Pacific surf and a Portland man and Huntington woman drowned in the Snake river.

The Clackamas victim was Fred Betteridge, 17, Portland, who was with a girl companion when he sank in midstream. At Waldport, James Ancel, 13, was pulled from the grasp of two companions when they fought the undertow.

Missing in the Snake river boating accident near Home, Ore., were Clyde Boylan, about 50, Portland, and Mrs. George Morton, 20, Huntington. Their bodies have not been recovered. Police said they were in a boat handled by Eric West, Webster, Ida, when it tipped and the two passengers tumbled in. West swam toward shore, dragging Mrs. Morton, but lost consciousness. When he came to he was on the bank-but couldn't find the woman. The couple had been picnicking Friday evening with friends on the Idaho shore. Mrs. Morton is survived by her husband and two small daughters.

Unemployment Payments Drop

WASHINGTON, Aug. 29 (AP)—New applications for jobless payments have dropped to the lowest level since last November.

The bureau of employment security said yesterday a steady slackening "in the rate of new industrial layoffs" is indicated in sharp drops in new unemployment since mid-July.

Initial claims indicating new unemployment numbered 239,207 during the week ended Aug. 30, the report said. This was a drop of 31,883 from the number filed the previous week.

Initial claims declined in 40 states.

Also filed, however, were 7533 claims from veterans who had been filing under the servicemen's readjustment benefit program. This program expired for most veterans July 25.
