

Robeson Gang Asks Dewey's Impeachment

PEEKSKILL, N.Y., Sept. 6 (AP)—Paul Robeson supporters, protesting the violence that swept the countryside after his concert near here Sunday, have called on President Truman to help "restore law and order in New York state."

But Westchester county District Attorney George M. Faneli, who had over-all command of a force of 800 law enforcement officers, says they did a "magnificent job."

The left-wing Negro singer's sympathizers also have demanded the impeachment of Gov. Thomas E. Dewey and Westchester county officials for not preventing the five-hour rioting.

More than 100 persons were injured as anti-leftist demonstrators hurled rocks and other missiles at autos and buses carrying the concert crowd home.

More than a dozen persons were arrested on various charges.

Windows of hundreds of vehicles were smashed in scattered attacks spread over many miles of roads in the suburbs 40 miles north of New York City. At least eight autos and an empty bus were overturned.

Robeson charged yesterday that many of the 10,000 concert-goers were "attacked by arms of the state and local government." He called the concert crowd "peacefully assembled American citizens."

The district attorney, commenting on the fact that the heavy police force prevented any serious disorder before and during the concert on an abandoned golf course, said:

"There would have been mass killing if they hadn't kept control at the danger center in the concert area. Even with 200 more officers, we couldn't have protected all the roads."

Officers took more than 200 baseball bats from Robeson sympathizers before the concert, Faneli said.

Police also seized some bayonets and rifle bolts from among 4000 veterans and other anti-Robesonites who started a noisy protest parade in front of the concert grounds.

Vincent J. Boyle, head of the associated veterans committee which sponsored the protest demonstration, said yesterday that Robeson "storm troopers" were to blame for the disorders.

Boyle said Robeson had promised in advance that he would provide his own protection, and that he brought along 3000 persons for that purpose.

"The Ku Klux Klan was not active in either riot," Boyle said. "And there were no racial issues involved."

Vaccinators Killed

Economy-Talking Senators Get A Lesson In Economy

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6 (AP)—Defense Secretary Louis Johnson, a big man with a bald head, caused a lot of grins in Washington with the jolt he has just handed a bunch of senators.

When Johnson, a businessman himself, took over the defense department last spring, he said he'd "knock heads together" if he had to, to make the armed forces work all right.

Since he has been in office, he has heard senators preaching the virtues of the free enterprise system and the need for economy in government spending.

Then Johnson got a letter from Senator Elmer Thomas, Oklahoma democrat and chairman of a subcommittee of the appropriations committee.

Needs in his letter Thomas told Johnson about 11 members of his committee wanted to take an "official" inspection trip to Europe, and some wanted to go around the world, and please, would he send them around in an air force plane.

(Since this was to be an "official" trip, it would be at government expense anyway, whether they went by air force plane or one of the airlines, or by boat.)

Johnson wrote Thomas he was sorry but there was economy to worry about in the armed services, and it cost about \$130 an hour to keep a plane in the air on such a trip, and please, would they just go by commercial plane. In short, he said no air force plane for the senators.

Then he put in the little reminder

about free enterprise: "... I have felt that I could not justify placing the armed services in competition with commercial carriers."

That's another way of saying that, since the government is going to have to foot the travel bill for the senators anyway, let them spend it on regular airline planes which stay in business by carrying passengers.

This must have been a shock to Thomas—the air force has always jumped when congressmen wanted to make "official" trips—for he said later: "I know senators will not be pleased."

Every year where congress closes, or is near closing, as this one is, senators and representatives scamper off in all directions around the world by plane or boat.

When they go—singly or in groups, as a committee—on "official" business, it's at government expense. That means that you, the taxpayer, pay for the ride, hotel, meals and so on.

One veteran house member, who hasn't missed a trip abroad for years, predicted that this year around half the 435 house members will be out of the country by the end of the year.

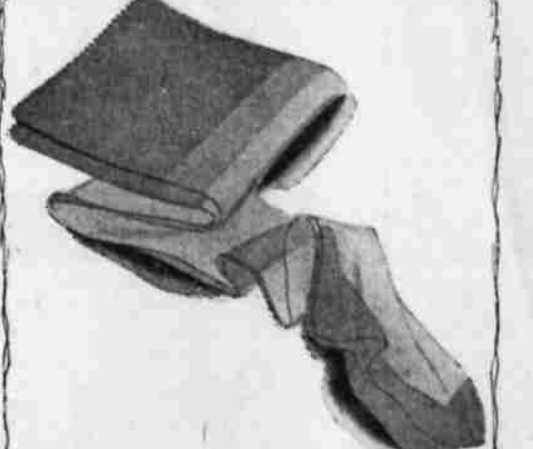

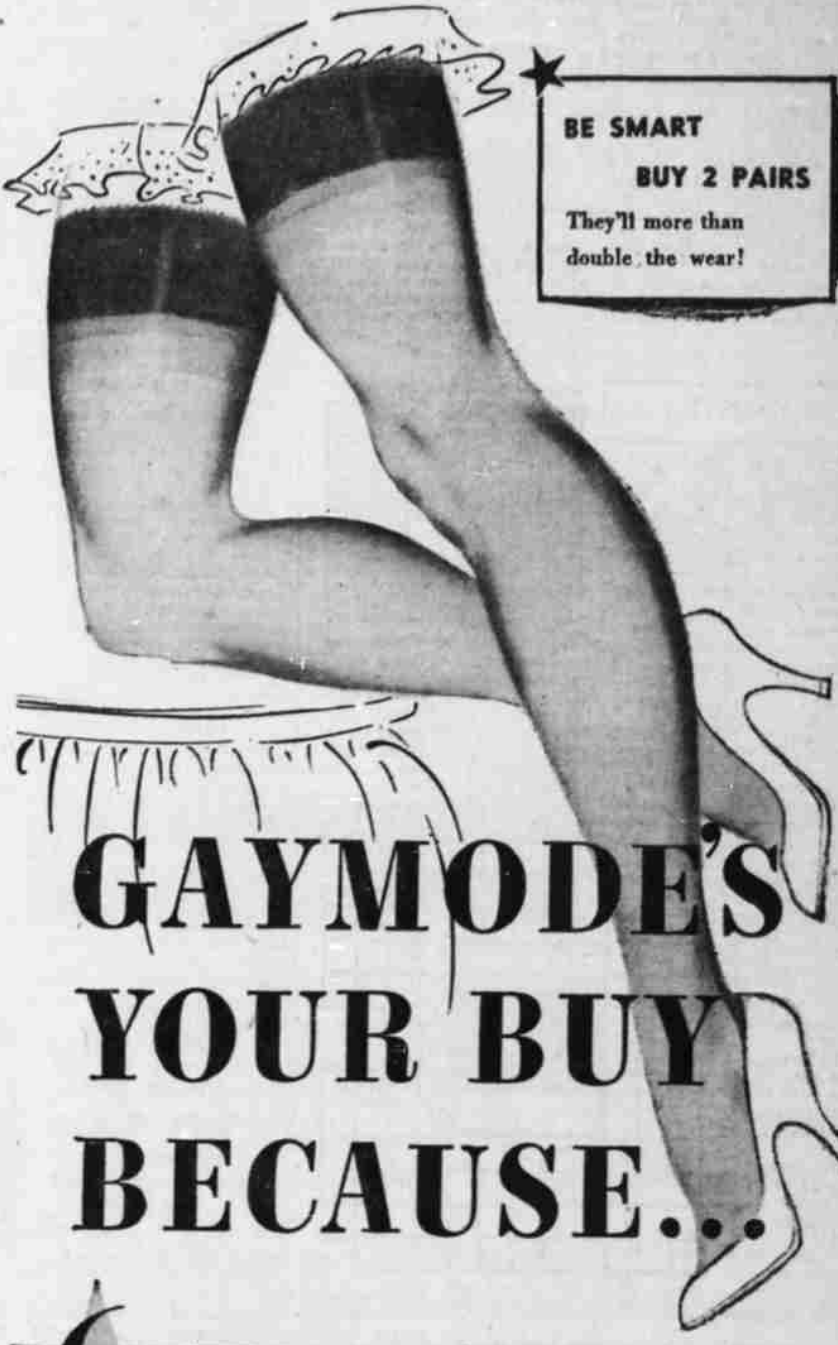
