

Rogue Valley Cavalcade Being Readied

Final rehearsals for Rogue Valley Cavalcade are now in progress with a total of 541 local participants. The cavalcade is a pageant-spectacle that will be presented by the Josephine county fair board on a huge outdoor stage the nights of September 14, 15, 16 and 18 at the county fairgrounds in Grants Pass.

The various episodes are sponsored by fraternal and service organizations throughout Josephine county. The latest group to enter the cast is a mass choir of over 300 voices made up of choirs from churches throughout the county. The group will be coordinated by Mrs. Sidney Bassett of Grants Pass.

The complete cast will consist of over 600 people, all fully costumed. Along with the great amount of

rolling stock required, such as covered wagons and stagecoaches, will be an original Stanley Steamer which will put in its appearance to blow up in the Gay 90's scene.

Tickets are now on sale by the contestants for the title of Queen of the Fair or may be purchased at 50¢ a member of commerce in Grants Pass.

\$50,000 Awaiting Donnie Lee

REDWOOD CITY, Calif., Sept. 6.—There's a small fortune awaiting Donnie Lee Nance Howard Childer Marcupulas, if she only knew it.

Donnie Lee, a former waitress, married Anthony Marcupulas, Redwood City restaurant owner, August 17, 1948. She later left him and Marcupulas died in December of the same year. He left no will.

Now Attorney F. W. Hammond Jr., of nearby San Carlos would like to locate her to present her with half of Marcupulas' \$50,000 estate, to which she is entitled under law. She is believed to be either in southern California or Texas.

Navy Board Begins B-36 Investigation

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6.—A board of admirals began a search today into the full origin of a once-anonymous document which touched off a capitol bill uproar by hinting at fraud in air force bomber buying.

One navy official, Cedric R. Worth, has been suspended for writing the document about B-36 purchasing and passing it on to house members. Now the three-man court of inquiry is trying to find out whether any other navy men had a hand in it.

The court, headed by Adm. Thomas C. Kinkaid, was reported to have asked only two or three little-known witnesses to appear at the first sessions starting this morning.

Their identities indicated the investigating board wanted first to find who wrote the document, and about what.

One of the witnesses was Cmdr. Thomas Davies, Worth, in testimony before the house armed services committee, mentioned he had talked with Davies. Another was Worth's secretary, Chief Yeoman Virginia Charles, 28-year old Wave of Easton, Pa.

PARK ENLARGED
PORTLAND, Sept. 3.—Portland's Wilderness park—an area to be preserved in its natural state—now is up to nearly 3000 acres. A 1400-acre tract was added yesterday. The park runs along the high ridge of northwest Portland.

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Advice To Surf Bathers--- Watch Those Rip Tides!

NEW YORK, Aug. 30.—When you swim in surf, don't worry about the undertow.

Undertow, blamed for countless drownings, probably doesn't even exist, says Dr. Francis P. Shepard, professor of submarine geology at the University of California's Scripps Institution of Oceanography.

The thing to watch for is rip currents, that come in puffs or pulses. They can carry you out through the breakers, and probably cause many drownings.

Contrary to popular belief, "there may be no such thing as undertow," he writes in Physics Today, magazine of the American Institute of Physics.

Undertow is supposed to be a strong current under the surface that sweeps bathers off their feet and drags them out to sea. It's supposed to come from water thrown shoreward by the breakers. At the

edge of a beach, you do feel returning water undermining the sand at your feet. The idea has been that this water continues as a strong subsurface current out through the breakers.

But no measurements have ever shown any dangerous subsurface current of this kind, Dr. Shepard reports.

They are currents that move in narrow bands out through the breakers, spreading out fanwise beyond. They extend from the surface all the way to the sea bottom, both inside the breakers and for some distance out. A drowning person, submerged, can be carried out by these deep currents.

The rips are caused by unevenness of the ocean floor, Dr. Shepard explains. Ridges or canyons slow or speed up different parts of the breaker as it comes in, thus piling up water at one point and thinning it at another. This surplus water flows along the shore until it meets

water coming from another point. The two currents merge and turn out to sea as a single current.

Rip currents are easy to spot from the air, and with practice can be detected from the beach, too, Dr. Shepard says.

They can be detected by turbulent brownish or greenish masses of water moving out from the breaker zone. They have somewhat the shape of a cauliflower cloud, and the edge of each rip is likely to be outlined by foam carried out from the surf.

From the beach, the rips can be spotted by the turbulence of the water along the lanes of flow, or a change in color of the water due to greater depth. The incoming

wave often does not break in the rip current lane. If it does break, the water is likely to have the typical brownish color.

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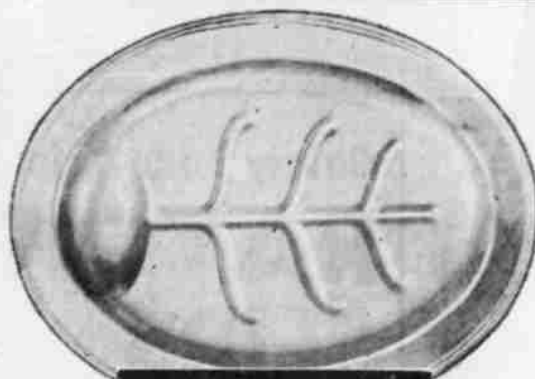
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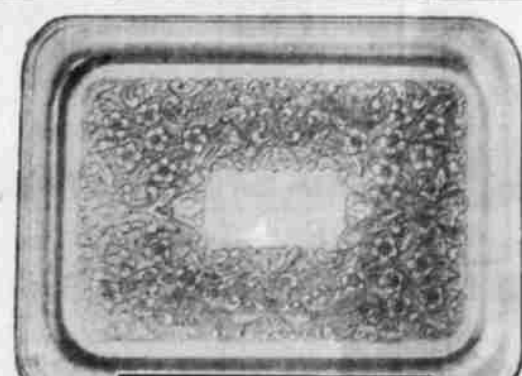
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
