CHICAGO, Sept. 7 (AP)—Corn moved up for gains extending to more than a cent in a steady to firm grain market today. Other cereals did not match the gains of corn, and wheat in particular was inclined to lag.

Dealings were not very active, being left mainly in the hands of local traders. May wheat was the weakest. There were sales in May wheat against purchases of December.

Rally Pushes Stocks Ahead

NEW YORK, Sept. 7 (AP)—A short, lively rally pushed the stock market ahead today.

Leading issues advanced fractions to more than a point before demand was satisfied. Top gains were pared here and there but on the whole the improvement was well maintained.

Buying interest quickened shortly before noon after a wobbly start and for a couple of hours quotations were steadily marked up.

Turnover was at the rate of around 900,000 shares for the full session.

Barnsdall oil bounced back smartly after losing more than a point each on Friday and Monday on news of a proposed merger with Ogen Corp., an investment company.

Among the gainers were General Motors, Chrysler, Studebaker, Standard Oil (N. J.), Radio Corp., Philco, Zenith, U. S. Rubber, Montgomery Ward, American Telephone and U. S. Gypsum.
