

Baked Alaska Is Easy Dessert

Looking for easy deluxe dessert? Here are two that begin with bakery cake and end with cries of "more, more!"

Chocolate Baked Alaska Cake
(6-8 Servings)

Four egg whites, 6 tablespoons sugar, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract, 1 (8-inch) layer bakers' cake, 1 quart chocolate ice cream.
Beat egg whites until stiff, but not dry. Blend in sugar and vanilla extract. Continue beating until meringue stands in peaks and is well blended. Place cake on a cookie sheet. Pipe ice cream on cake, leaving about 1/2-inch around edge of cake uncovered. Cover ice cream and cake with meringue, making sure that ice cream is well covered by the meringue. Brown quickly in a hot oven (450 degrees F.) for approximately five minutes. Serve immediately.

Pineapple-Coconut Custard Cake
(8 servings)

One-half package (1 1/2 ounces) prepared vanilla pudding, 1 cup milk, 1 (13-ounce) bakers' angel food cake, 1 cup grated coconut, cup pineapple tidbits.
Prepare vanilla pudding according to directions on package. Cool until lukewarm. Pour pudding over angel food cake. Top with coconut and pineapple tidbits.

A tempting way to enjoy our plentiful apple supply is to put them into a scalloped dish. Allow about 2 small apples per person. Wash, core and slice them. Place them in layers in a baking dish. Sprinkle each layer with sugar and a little salt. Dot with table fat. Add a little water, sprinkle with crumbs, if desired. Cover and bake in a moderate oven (375 degrees F.) 30 to 40 minutes or until tender. During the last 15 minutes of baking, remove the cover for browning.

A dramatic pattern of "Squares" shows the plain weave but slightly fuzzy texture of press cloth. This new fabric is particularly good for modern draperies and slipcovers.

Rich damask, with the interesting tone-on-tone effect of imported fabrics is made of all nylon
