

Bears Reveal Power But May Lack Finesse

California Will Miss Jolting Jackie Jensen

BERKELEY, Calif., Sept. 8 (AP)—University of California will field a big, bruising football squad again this season. By sheer numbers it will grind some of the opposition into the ground.

The team, however, doesn't boast the class of last year's co-champion of the Pacific Coast conference and Rose Bowl loser to Northwestern. The absence of Jack Jensen is the big reason.

Pullbacks like Jensen are flushed out only occasionally. When he cast his lot with professional baseball the Bears lost their greatest backfield threat. His replacement, Pete Schabram, is a hard hitting ball packer but Jensen was in a class by himself.

A new blow hit the Bears last night. John Cunningham, first string right end for three years, was ruled ineligible because he attended Texas State Teachers' college through the 1942 football season.

And when three-year letterman Doug Duncan failed to return, California was weakened at center.

Coach Lynn Waldorf commented gloomily that Cunningham's loss accentuated his problem.

LETTERMEN BACK

With the exception of George Stathakis, sophomore center, however, the Bears will have lettermen starting at every position on the offensive team. Waldorf again will use the two-plate system, one team on offense and the other on defense.

On the other side of the line, Rod Franz, guard and Jim Turner, tackle, have won three letters each. So have Left Half Billy Main and Right Half Jack Swanner. The 200-pound Swanner is as hard hitting a back as will be found on any coast gridiron. Norm Pressley, a letterman, replaced Cunningham at right end.

George Souza, end; Jim Cullom, tackle and Ray De Long, guard, make up the left side of the line on offense. Bob Celari has first call on the quarterbacking job. He's a solid workman and a pretty good pass thrower but hardly can be classified as a brilliant tactician.

California sizes up as a strong defensive club and less powerful on offense than a year ago. Except at the quarterback and tackle positions, it has depth exceeding most of its rivals.

Dog Trials Open Friday

At eight o'clock tomorrow morning, more than 130 of the top retriever dogs in the nation will perform on land and in the water at Kerns ranch, near Keno, in a regular A.K.C. trial for retriever dogs.

Tomorrow morning marks the start of the post-war stake. Saturday morning, same time, the derby will get under way. The derby will be followed by the open all-day stake which continues all day Sunday.

Among the dogs here for the trials will be Brinnall's Gringo, a national champion. The dog is owned by Cliff Brinnall of Los Angeles.

Three field trial champions will be among the dogs competing in the canine experts.

This post-war affair will be by far the largest retriever trial ever held in the Klamath area.

Kerns ranch should prove to be an ideal spot for the three-day event. A small lake will afford the best in water work and the adjacent land is in good cover.

Spectators will be able to get into the area easily and will have an excellent view of the proceedings.

Golden Grand Purses Total Over \$200,000

Ohmer Webb Drags Down \$5442 For 40-Minute Shoot

VANDALIA, O., Sept. 8 (AP)—They called it the "Golden Grand"—and that's just what it was!

The auditors finished figuring today on the recently-completed ninety-third Grand American Trapshoot, and the prize payoff was practically preposterous.

Ray E. Loring, manager of the Amateur Trapshooting association since the early 30's, announced that about \$220,000 in purses had been distributed to the 1800 Dead-End Dicks and Doras who competed this year.

The big winner was Ohmer Webb of Washington, D. C., who broke 100 straight to capture the 100-day preliminary handicap. Webb, with the only perfect score in the event, dragged down \$5442 for his 40 minutes of shooting.

For the first time in a half-century the feature event, the Grand American Handicap, wound up in a perfect-score tie. That cut down the first place payoff to some extent, but Pete Donat of Antwerp, O., and J. W. Sondeman of Lima, O., picked up checks of \$5281.25 each.

The marksmen, gathered from all parts of the Western hemisphere, fired 1,105,300 shells in actual competition.

NEW YORK, Sept. 8 (AP)—A rising stock market faltered in its stride in late trading today.

Gains were in a clear majority. The largest advances were trimmed in most cases, though, and a handful of stocks backed into minus territory.

Turnover was at the rate of about 900,000 shares for the full session.

The morning demand, which started to peter out around mid-session, apparently represented a spillover from yesterday.

Wall Street had a number of economic reports to mull over but none seemed to exert much force on market action.

Higher prices were paid most of the day for U. S. Steel, General Motors, Chrysler, Goodrich, Zenith, Dow Chemical, Union Pacific and U. S. Gypsum.

Wobly spots included Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, General Electric and Johns-Manville.
