Sub Disaster Survivors Home To Warm Welcome

GROTON, Conn., Sept. 9 (AP)—The men of the Cochino, only United States submarine lost since the war, came home yesterday to a heart warming welcome.

They were aboard the submarine Tusk, which snatched them from Arctic waters in a stirring rescue off Norway on August 25 after a series of unexplained explosions had sunk their own craft.

Approximately 100 wives, children, sweethearts and other relatives were on the submarine base dock to greet the survivors.

The joy of reunion was tempered with grief at the loss of six Tusk crewmen and a civilian technician, who was aboard the Cochino.

As the Tusk nosed into the dock, crewmen from the two submarines stood at attention on her deck and her flag was at half-mast. The waiting families thronged on the pier.

When the Tusk and Cochino crewmen were permitted to leave the vessel, some of the embraces would have outdone Hollywood.

Woman Lists Housewives' House Wants

PORTLAND, Sept. 9 (AP)—The Oregon Association of Real Estate Boards was told yesterday what the housewife wants in a house—and the list was a bit surprising.

It ranged all the way from a garage disposal unit to a garage tool cabinet "so my husband would stay home more."

Mrs. R. B. Butler, Tulsa, Okla., president of the women's council of the board, told the state convention that 60 per cent of houses are sold because the housewife likes them.

So she queried 3000 women as to what they would like in a house. They like:

1. Double garages—not for two cars, usually, just for storage space.
2. No ceiling lights in the bedroom, "because a woman looks 10 years younger when the light does not shine in her face."
3. A new-fashioned pantry, "to store toothpicks, false teeth, pots and pans, etc."
4. A place for bicycles, tricycles, and toys.

And, on the routine side, the women want larger bedrooms, built-in medicine chests, two bathrooms at least. They would appreciate a fireplace in the kitchen, and they look with disfavor on the new style of combined living-and-dining areas.

Ninety nine per cent of the women want a traditional dining room.
