Initiation — The Degree of Honor will meet at the KC hall Monday, September 12, at 8 p.m. Initiation will be held and all officers are asked to wear formals.

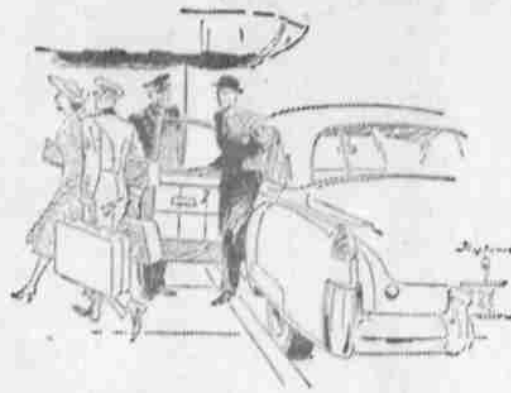
Home from Hospital — Mrs. Louis Brown of 3702 Summers lane has been released from the Klamath Valley hospital after major surgery and is now at home.

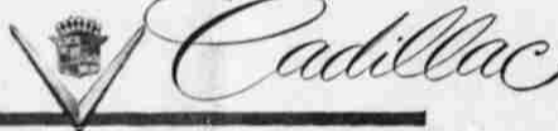

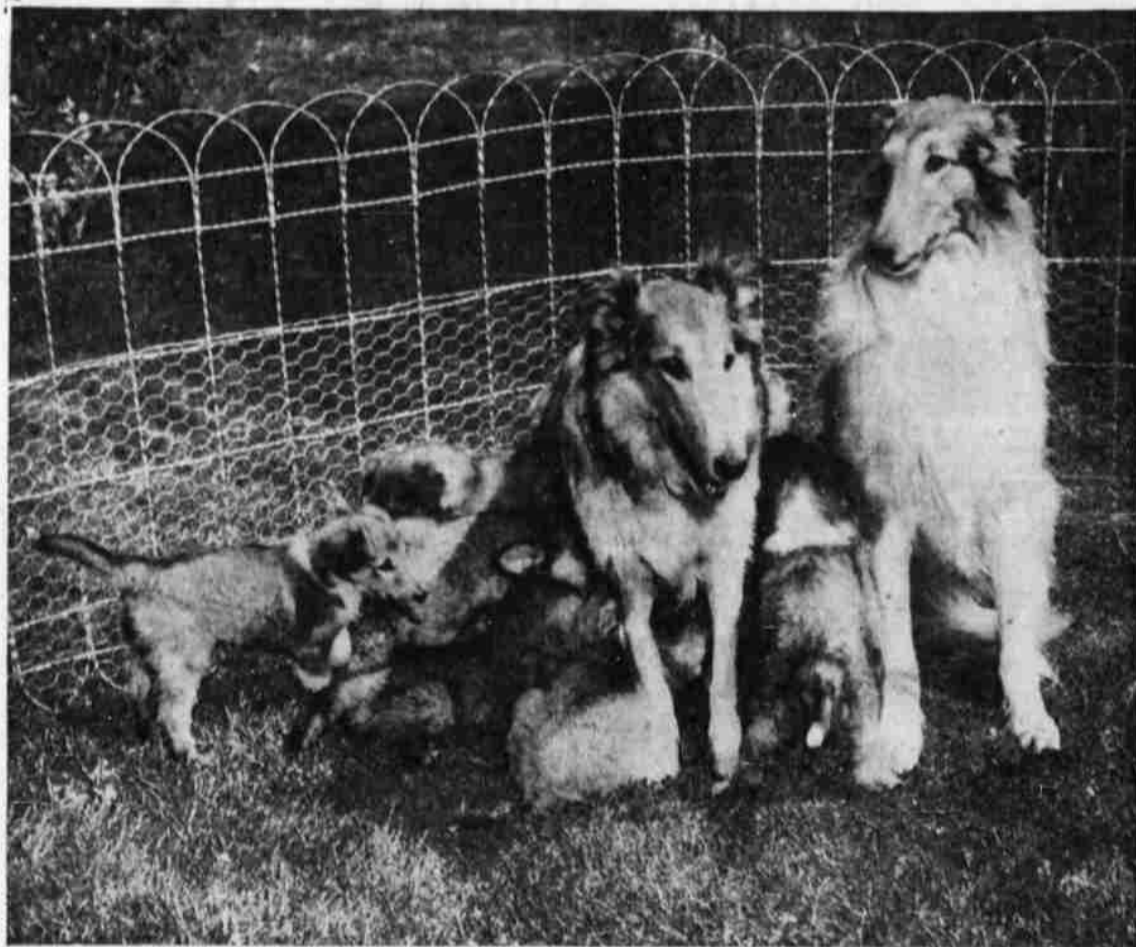
