

KF, Browns Play Off Tie

REDDING, Sept. 12 (Special)—With Pittsburgh standing by to play the victor, Klamath Falls and Redding meet tonight here at Redding in the fifth and final game of their playoff series.

Pittsburgh, Far West league champion, defeated Willows three out of five games in the southern series, winning yesterday 11-8 after losing 10-1 Saturday night.

Klamath Falls won over the Browns Saturday night 4-2, with Johnny Lopenman holding the Browns to seven hits, but last night Ralph Lineberger twisted an even better game to whip the Gems 3-1. He had as hitout for eight innings.

So the series is all square at two games each. Stan Gilson will start on the hill for Klamath Falls tonight, facing either Percy Fisher or Jim Howard.

Last night's pitching duel between Joe Nicholas and Lineberger rocked along for five and a half frames without a score, but in the bottom of the sixth with one out Ray Perry tagged Nicholas for his first playoff home run.

Redding's second run of that inning was hit by a pitch. Russ Rosenberg bounced to Dick Descalzo, playing third base in a pinch, and Descalzo sailed the ball far past Mike Fernandez at first. Johnson scampered around to score.

Porky Aces, Wins Idaho Open Golf

BOISE, Sept. 12 (AP)—Ed (Porky) Oliver of Seattle snatched a hole in one on the fifth hole yesterday, and went on to win the Idaho open golf tournament with an 11-under-par 205.

The Seattle professional, who topped 130 amateurs and money players in the 54-hole medal play, was four strokes ahead of the leading amateur, Rod Duden of Portland, Ore., who carded a 209.

Oliver's score for the final 36 holes was 137. He toured the plantation course in a four under par 68 the day before. The former Ryder Cup team member shot his hole-in-one on the second 18 for the day.

The runner-up professional was Marvin (Bud) Ward of Great Falls, Mont., with a 212. He shot a final round of 74-68. Stan Leonard of Vancouver, B. C., was third with a 213.

Big Train Won Three Series Tilts

The Herald and News sports department will go to great lengths to answer questions for curious fans, even to crawling out of bed at untimely hours on Sunday morning to prow through the reference books.

Yesterday's top question was: "Did Walter Johnson ever win a world series baseball game?" A couple of fellows had a wager on the proposition. The answer:

Yes, Walter Johnson won three world series games. In 1924 Johnson had been with the Washington Senators 18 years without getting into the annual fall classic, but that year the Senators went into the series with the New York Giants and won in seven games.

Johnson lost the first 4-3, lost the second 6-2 and won the third 4-3 in 12 innings. He came in as a relief pitcher in the ninth.

In 1925, Washington vs. the Pittsburgh Pirates, Johnson won the first game 4-1, won the second game 4-0 and lost the seventh and deciding game 9-7.

Thus the Big Train had a world series record of three wins and three losses in two series, pitched 50 innings and had an earned run average of 3.6.

ALBANY, Sept. 12 (AP)—Two young men were killed near here Saturday night when their motorcycle crashed into the rear of an automobile and then plunged into the path of another. Both cars were ditched and one woman passenger was injured.

Coroner Glen Huston said the victims were Laurence A. Dickey, 23, and Cecil John Saunders, 19, both of Albany.

State Police Sgt. Ernest Larios said the cycle plunged into the rear of a car driven by J. D. Canavan, Lebanon. His wife was treated for injuries.

ISTANBUL, Turkey, Sept. 12 (AP)—A bomb exploded at the Turkish consulate in Plovdiv, Bulgaria, last Friday the semi-official news agency Anatolia reported today. There were no deaths, the report said.

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Merrill Road Widening Job Progressing

The roughest, dustiest stretch of main road in the county just now is the eight-mile strip of highway 39 between Henley and Merrill.

The road is being widened but remains open to travel. The highway shoulders have been built up and the roadbed for most of the eight miles has been overlaid with crushed rock and gravel preparatory to surfacing.

A dangerous curve just north of the Wong ranch and another below Mac's store are being smoothed out in the construction.

One detour on the road has been in use for several days, but is not a part of the highway construction. The bridge across the Lost river diversion canal has been closed off while widening work on the channel progresses, necessitating a 150-yard detour over a temporary bridge at Henley.
