Elliott Loses In Committee Ballot Test

PORTLAND, Sept. 12 (AP)—One fourth of Multnomah county's democratic central committee members support, 148 to 51, Sheriff M. L. Elliott. He faces a recall threat to his office.

The ballot was taken last night at a meeting called by Chairman Nicholas Granet. About 300 of the party's 800 precinct workers attended.

Five members spoke from the floor in favor of the young sheriff after Granet announced the ballot plan. No one spoke out against Elliott. Later, State Senator Richard Neuberger, a democrat who has opposed Elliott's tenure in office, criticized Granet's handling of the meeting. He said the chairman had used "Granet's rules of order—not Robert's rules." He said Granet prevented opposition speakers from being recognized by the chair.

US Solons Scan Medical Plan

LONDON, Sept. 13 (AP)—Britain's socialized medicine program has been getting the attention of 16 U. S. congressmen.

The group came here to study the British and other European health plans in the light of President Truman's proposed federal health service. They spent yesterday talking to Health Minister Aneurin Bevan and other top officials.

BOSTON, Sept. 13 (AP)—The Massachusetts legislature has been asked to reverse the convictions of 21 persons hanged 257 years ago. The action would absolve 16 women and five men accused of witchcraft in Salem in 1692. They were hanged between June and September of that year. Rep. Daniel Ruden (D-Boston) filed the resolve yesterday.

23 Years Ago

Monday, September 12, 1926—Actual construction on the \$75,000 brick building on the lot between the Winters building and the Shell oil station on Eighth and Main was started today. This business building of two stories, is being erected by D. O. Williams of this city and plans call for completion before winter.
