## Coyotes Disappearing From Yamhill

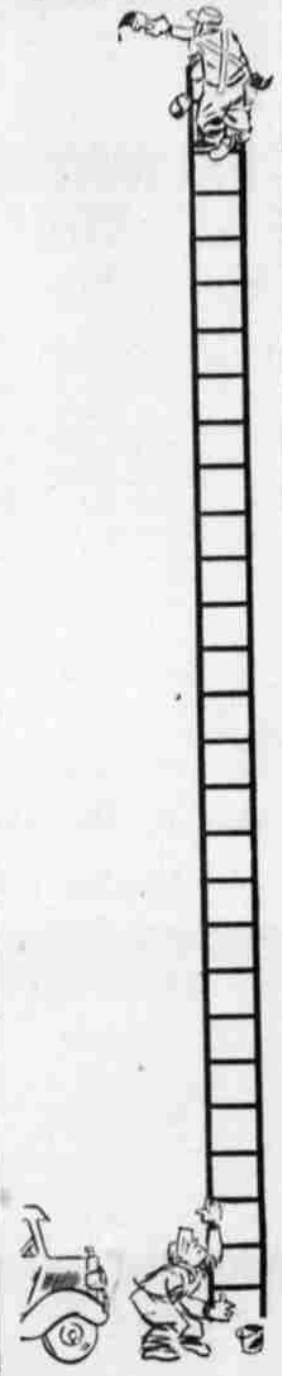
