

## New Zealand Dangles Lures For U.S. Tourist Dollars

WELLINGTON, New Zealand, Sept. 15 (AP)—This country is going to try to sell scenery and lamb to Americans to help meet the dollar crisis.

New Zealand finds it difficult to prune her dollar spending by 25 per cent along with other British commonwealth countries. The reason is that dollar spending already is down to the bare bones.

Two years ago New Zealand cut imports of American newspaper, motor cars and other consumer goods. Not one new license to import American automobiles has been issued this year.

**Further Cut**  
New Zealand will cut dollar spending still more. She likely will stop importing timber from the east coast of America, cut down on other imports. She will seek more new-firm, farm tractors, and industrial machinery from sterling countries.

At the same time New Zealand hopes to build up her dollar earnings.

New Zealand's trout streams, hot springs, ski resorts, mountain scen-

ery and deep sea fishing grounds are big tourist assets.

The government is sending Roy M. Pirth, a good salesman and assistant manager of the tourist department, to the United States to sell New Zealand from a tourist angle.

Meanwhile, the government is getting ready to welcome dollar spending Americans.

**Spruce Up**  
All state-owned hotels and tourist houses have been told to spruce up their ideas of service. They also have been granted liquor licenses. Even New Zealanders say there are not enough drinking places in the country.

New Zealand is a great primary producing country. She hopes some of her products will win more U.S. dollars.

Almost all her surplus meat, butter, and cheese goes to Britain. The flag-loving New Zealanders want this to go on.

But New Zealand government men, worried by the dollar problem, think some lamb can be sent to the United States without much loss to Britain. The quantity being talked of is two shipments in a year—something over 10,000 tons.

**Butter Trouble**  
Butter is another potential dollar earner, but men close to the government see a political snag here. New Zealanders are rationed to eight ounces a week. They will stand this rationing only as long as all the surplus goes to Britain.

If the government decides to send butter to U.S. and retains the ration, the labor party will lose a lot of votes in this year's general election.

New Zealand also is trying to plug a dollar leak in the resale of New Zealand wool to the United States by continental buyers. All New Zealand shippers of wool now are required to sign a declaration of the ultimate destination of wool exported.

## Former KF Resident Dies

Mors, died Monday night in the Siskiyou County General hospital in Yreka after a brief illness. The Morses were residents of Klamath Falls in 1935-36 and in 1941-42. Mors has been on the Shasta division since 1922.

Funeral services under the direction of Noble's chapel in the Dunsmuir Methodist church, Rev. T. Ermer Smith officiating, Mrs. Mors was an ardent worker in the church. Interment will be in the Dunsmuir cemetery.

A native of Kansas, Mrs. Mors is survived by her husband, two daughters, Dorothy of Dunsmuir, and Mrs. Margaret Veliquette of Sacramento; a son, Robert of Redding; brother Carlton E. Welborn of Portland; and sisters Mrs. Robert Patterson of Portland, Mrs. Grace Atwood of Corvallis, and Mrs. Ruth Jorgensen of Seattle.

## Child's Body Found In Mill Pond

LEBANON, Sept. 15 (AP)—The body of two-year-old Dana Jensen was found in a mill pond early today, ending a search that had been joined by virtually the entire city.

The little boy, son of Mr. and Mrs. Cliff Jensen, wandered away from his home, firemen dragged the near-by mill pond because he had been seen in that vicinity early in the evening.

Before the body was found, a sound-truck toured the city appealing for volunteers to join the search, and hundreds of people responded.

## Douglas Fir Orders Up Sharply

PORTLAND, Sept. 15 (AP)—Orders for Douglas fir lumber jumped sharply last month.

The West Coast Lumbermen's association reported an average of 182,709,000 board feet was ordered each week. It was the highest average since August of a year ago.

Production averaged 167,260,000 a week, highest since May, and shipments averaged 162,927,000 despite a late summer freight car shortage.

## High Price Paid For Ponderosa

PORTLAND, Sept. 15 (AP)—A government timber sale has brought a price of \$21 a thousand board feet for ponderosa pine in Deschutes county. It was paid by the Gilchrist Timber company, Gilchrist.

The average price for ponderosa pine in several tracts sold was \$19.62. The pine had been appraised at \$14.65.

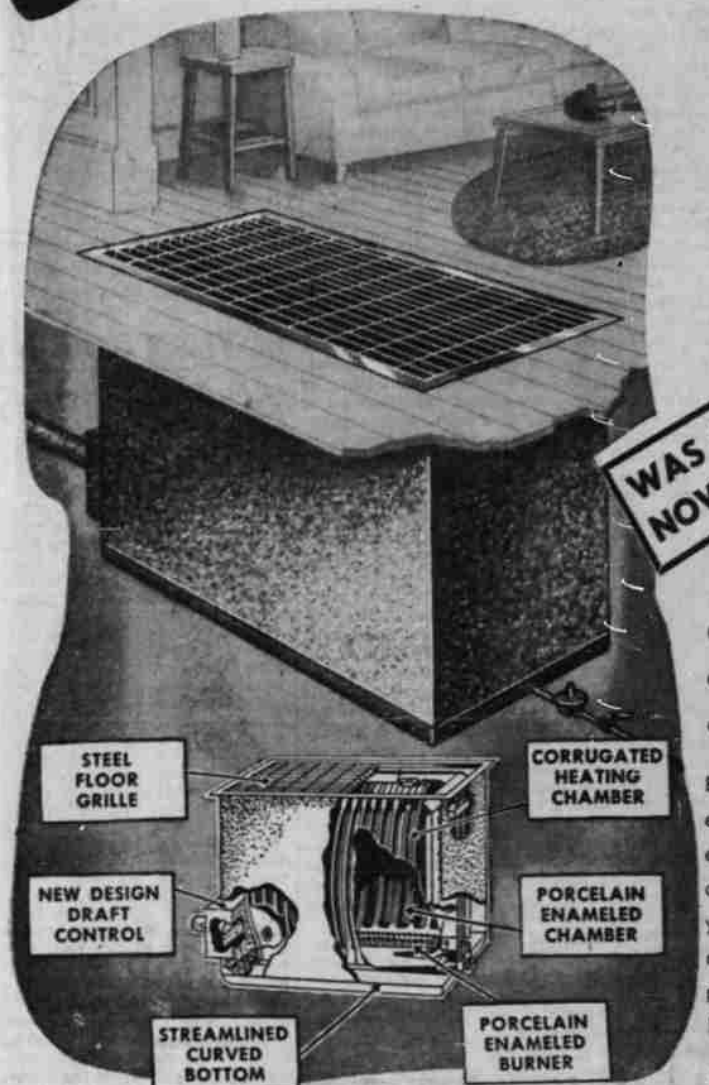

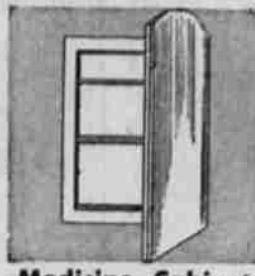

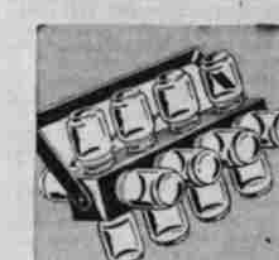
