

Jobless Job-Hunter Needs Plenty Of Patience, Grit

CHICAGO (NEA)—"There's one thing I have learned in the past few months—jobs are mighty tough to find." So says Howard Hagemann, 23, who calls himself "the most professional-looking unemployed man on Michigan boulevard."

Hagemann graduated from Beloit (Wis.) college early in June. He started to hunt for a job, but he did it in an especially business-like manner. First he commanded a desk and a secretary in his father's office. Then he began a rigorous schedule of making contacts, writing letters, seeing people, filling out forms.

Tough Day
Hagemann's "working day" would rival that of a working-for-pay businessman, and his neatly dressed form, hurrying along to keep an appointment, is becoming familiar along Michigan boulevard. But, after two months without missing a day on the job, Hagemann has no prospects of employment.

"Yep," he sighed, "I work as hard as anybody. There's only one difference—no pay. This routine is really getting me. Sometimes when I'm tired at night I find myself saying to my wife, 'Gosh, honey, I don't feel like going to work tomorrow!'"

Hagemann attributes his lack of success so far to the fact that he's
