LAKEVIEW, Sept. 16—Details of the proposed federal timber sustained yield unit, aimed to assure an adequate annual supply of forest service timber in the Lakeview working circle and to retain the payroll and employment benefits from the primary sawmilling and re-manufacture of that timber within the same area, will be laid before the Lake County chamber of commerce forum luncheon at Hotel Lakeview Monday noon, September 19, by the chamber's industrial committee.

The committee has been working out plans for such a unit for more than a year and last Thursday, with plans virtually complete, they went to Klamath Falls and met with the industrial committee of the Klamath County chamber of commerce to explain the proposal and secure cooperation of that area in view of the point that the Klamath basin would be benefited by a healthy economy in the Lakeview area.
