SPOKANE, Sept. 20 (AP)—Employees of the Interstate Telephone company ended their 12-day strike yesterday and returned to work under a new contract.

"Some adjustments in the wage scale were agreed to, with further adjustments dependent upon proper approval of rate revisions in the three states within which we operate," he said. "The wage adjustments will no doubt result in increased costs to telephone users."

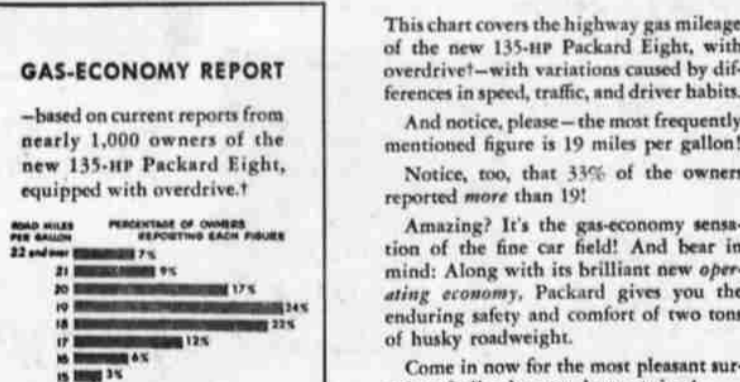
